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| HB14 | Schexnayder | TAX/SALES & USE |
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- (Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes the legislature to provide by law for the collection of sales and use taxes levied within the state (Item #27)
- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
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| HB16 | Echols | TAX CREDITS |
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- Establishes a tax credit for eligible expenses incurred in the rehabilitation of historic structures included on the National Register of Historic Places (Item #19)
- Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 55, nays 38. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
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| HB17 | Bishop, S. | TAX/CORP FRANCHISE |
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- Suspends the corporation franchise tax levied on certain taxable capital and suspends the initial corporation franchise tax levied on certain entities (Item #16)
- Read by title, reconsidered, returned to the calendar, under the rules.
 - Rules suspended.
 - Called from the calendar.
 - Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 67, nays 29. The bill, not having received two-thirds vote of the elected members, failed to pass.
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| HB23 | Dwight | TAX/AD VALOREM TAX |
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- (Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes certain agreements that provide for payments in lieu of ad valorem taxes (Item #28)
- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
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| HB26 | Zeringue | COLLEGES/UNIVERSITIES |
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- Extends, with limitations, the authority of public postsecondary education management boards to establish and increase student fees (Item #41)
- Read by title, returned to the calendar.
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| HB28 | Dwight | TAX/AD VALOREM TAX |
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- Authorizes agreements between political subdivisions and taxpayers that may provide for certain payments in lieu of ad valorem taxes (Item #28)
- Rules suspended.
 - Called from the calendar.
 - Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 60, nays 38. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
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| HB36 | Ivey | TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION |
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- (Constitutional Amendment) Establishes certain property tax exemptions for capital investment projects (Item #28)
- Rules suspended, called out of its regular order.
 - Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 93, nays 0. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the elected members, was finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.
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| HB41 | Ivey | TAX/AD VALOREM TAX |
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- (Constitutional Amendment) Establishes an ad valorem tax exemption for capital investment projects and for certain property subject to a cooperative endeavor agreement requiring the property owner to make payments in lieu of taxes (Item #28)
- Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 46, nays 43. The bill, not having received two-thirds vote of the elected members, failed to pass. Motion to reconsider pending.

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| HB50 | Ivey | TAX/AD VALOREM TAX |
| | <p>Authorizes local taxing authorities to enter into cooperative endeavor agreements that provide for payments in lieu of taxes (Item #28)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rules suspended, called out of its regular order. - Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 83, nays 12. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate. | |
| HB52 | Coussan | TAX CREDITS |
| | <p>Increases the amount of the Digital Interactive Media and Software Tax Credit, requires the increase to be used for training employees from certain disadvantaged groups, and expands eligibility to include information technology services (Item #19)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read by title, returned to the calendar. | |
| HB54 | Ivey | TAX/AD VALOREM-EXEMPTION |
| | <p>Provides for ad valorem tax exemptions for certain capital investment projects (Item # 28)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rules suspended, called out of its regular order. - Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 88, nays 7. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate. | |
| HB58 | Firment | LIABILITY |
| | <p>Provides relative to limitations of liability due to the COVID-19 public health emergency (Item #40)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Called from the calendar. - Read by title, referred to the Committee on Civil Law and Procedure. | |
| HB62 | Zeringue | UNEMPLOYMENT COMP |
| | <p>Provides for state income tax withholdings on unemployment compensation benefits (Item #32)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading. - Scheduled for floor debate on 06/18/20. | |
| HB64 | Stefanski | TAX/GAMING |
| | <p>Levies a state tax on the net revenue of fantasy sports contests (Item #17)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 83, nays 9. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the elected members, was finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate. | |
| HB65 | Wright | EMPLOYMENT |
| | <p>Requires short-term COVID-19 occupational forecasts (Item #15)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading. - Scheduled for floor debate on 06/18/20. | |
| HB70 | Jenkins | TAX/TAX REBATES |
| | <p>Extends Enterprise Zone Program incentives to essential critical infrastructure workers by authorizing the payment of a one-time hazard pay rebate (Item #18)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Reported with amendments (12-0). | |
| HB71 | Duplessis | FUNDS/FUNDING |
| | <p>Provides for a death benefit for certain public employees who die from COVID-19 (Item #11)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on Appropriations. | |
| HB72 | Crews | INSURANCE/HEALTH |
| | <p>Provides relative to billing by noncontracted facility-based physicians (Item #37)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on Insurance. | |

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| HCR5 | Freeman | LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS | Requests a study of the continuity of government provisions by the house and senate governmental affairs committees, meeting jointly <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Called from the calendar.- Read by title, amended, roll called on final consideration, yeas 95, nays 0. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate. |
| HCR10 | Bagley | SCHOOLS/BUS OPERATORS | Requests governing authorities of public schools to continue operational pay for school bus operators during emergencies <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, roll called on final consideration, yeas 98, nays 0. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate. |
| HCR16 | Bourriaque | FUNDS/FUNDING | Memorializes Congress and the Louisiana congressional delegation to clarify the eligibility of freshwater fisheries impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to receive CARES Act dollars <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, amended, roll called on final consideration, yeas 97, nays 0. The resolution was adopted and ordered to the Senate. |
| HCR17 | Carpenter | EMPLOYMENT | Requests certain state agencies and private businesses to recognize the value that justice-involved persons bring to the workforce and society, and to act with the intention to empower, train, and employ such individuals <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading.- Scheduled for floor debate on 06/18/20. |
| HCR21 | Marcelle | LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS | Commends the Black Lives Matter movement <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Prefiled.- Read by title. Lies over under the rules. |
| HR19 | Willard | STATE AGENCIES | Directs the La. Department of Health and Department of Veterans Affairs to implement policies for the health and safety of long-term care facility residents <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, recommitted to the Committee on Appropriations. |
| HR20 | Mincey | HOUSE/RULES | Provides relative to conference committee reports <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading.- Scheduled for floor debate on 06/18/20. |
| HR23 | Ivey | ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT | Requests a study of data points used for performance analysis by the Department of Economic Development <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Reported favorably (11-0). |
| HR24 | Wheat | COASTAL RES/WETLANDS | Urges and requests the Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority to work with the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to develop integrated coastal protection projects aimed at preserving and maintaining healthy estuarine and essential fish habitat in and around Lake Pontchartrain <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read by title, roll called, yeas 97, nays 0. The resolution was adopted. |

SB4 Foil TAX/FRANCHISE/CORPORATE
Extends the sunset of the research and development tax credit. (Item #19) (1/1/21)

- Scheduled for floor debate on 06/18/20.

SB6 Allain TAX/FRANCHISE/CORPORATE
Provides for the suspension of the corporation franchise tax and initial corporation franchise tax for small business corporations. (Item #16) (gov sig)

- Reported favorably (10-0). Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB13 Ward ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
Provides for the Louisiana New Markets Jobs Act. (Item #19) (8/1/20)

- Reported with amendments (11-0). Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SCR4 Foil TAX/TAXATION
Requests the study of the feasibility of establishing a tax credit program as a funding mechanism for public-private partnership investment in Louisiana infrastructure projects.

- Reported favorably (10-0).
