- SB12 Fesi UNCLAIMED PROPERTY
Constitutional amendment to dedicate unclaimed property funds and to create the Louisiana Unclaimed Property Permanent Trust Fund. (2/3 - CA13s1(A)) (Item #10) (7/1/21)
- Called from the Calendar.
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB18 Fesi FUNDS/FUNDING
Dedication of unclaimed property funds and creation of Louisiana Unclaimed Property Permanent Trust Fund. (Item #10) (See Act)
- Called from the Calendar.
- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 0 nays; ordered reengrossed and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB24 Harris, Jimmy TAX/TAXATION
Provides for eligibility for the Angel Investor Tax Credit for investments made in federal opportunity zones. (Item #19) (gov sig)
- Reported favorably.
- Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.
- SB27 White, B STATE AGENCIES
Creates and provides for the Streamlining Government Commission. (Item #33) (gov sig)
- Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Read by title; Committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to third reading and final passage.
- SCR4 Foil TAX/TAXATION
Requests the study of the feasibility of establishing a tax credit program as a funding mechanism for public-private partnership investment in Louisiana infrastructure projects.
- Received from the House without amendments.
- SCR11 Reese EMPLOYMENT
Urges and requests certain state agencies and private businesses in Louisiana to recognize the value that justice-involved persons can bring to the workforce and society and to act with intention to empower, train, and employ such individuals.
- Senate amendments read and adopted. Read by title and adopted by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays; ordered engrossed and sent to the House.
- SCR13 Carter, Troy WORKFORCE COMMISSION
Requests the Louisiana Workforce Commission to distribute information regarding the provisions of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act that provides paid sick time to employees who are unable to work due to the effects of COVID-19.
- Read by title and adopted by a vote of 35 yeas and 0 nays. Ordered sent to the House.
- SCR21 Mills, Robert COMMENDATIONS
Commends Benton High School Lady Tigers girls basketball team on winning the Class 5A state championship.
- Enrolled. Signed by the President of the Senate.
- SCR22 Carter, Troy CONGRESS
Memorializes Congress to extend the certification for an 8(a) business by one additional year if the business was certified by January 1, 2020.

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Extends the date for eligible expenses to qualify for the tax credit for the rehabilitation of historic structures and extends the effectiveness of the credit (Item #19)

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB5 Marino CIVIL/LAW

Provides for the emergency suspension of time limitations in certain civil proceedings (Item #40)

- Read by title, passed by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB6 Ivey FUNDS/FUNDING

Establishes the State Cybersecurity and Information Technology Fund and dedicates revenues to the fund (Items #10 and #11)

- Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title, passed by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB11 Stefanski TAX/SALES & USE

Provides for the amount of compensation persons required to collect state sales and use tax may deduct for remitting taxes (Item #30)

- Rules suspended. Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB13 Wright TAX CREDITS

Authorizes certain retail businesses to participate in the Enterprise Zone incentive (Item #18)

- Rules suspended. Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB19 Pressly TAX/TAX REBATES

Extends eligibility requirements for certain industries to participate in the Quality Jobs Program (Item #18)

- Rules suspended. Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB21 Magee COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS

Provides relative to motor vehicle repairs (Item #39)

- Read by title, passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 1 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB27 Zeringue COURTS/COURT REPORTERS

Provides relative to the creation of the certified shorthand reporters fund (Items #10 and #11)

- Read by title, passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 1 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB35 Bishop, S. FUNDS/FUNDING

Creates the Capital Outlay Savings Fund (Items #10 and #11)

- Rules suspended. Reported favorably. Rules suspended. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.

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- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

- HB37 Harris, Lance REVENUE DEPARTMENT
Requires the Department of Revenue to waive penalties and interest for certain taxpayers for tax years 2019 and 2020 (Item #29)

 - Rules suspended. Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
 - Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

- HB39 Davis UTILITIES
Provides relative to the Louisiana Electric Utility Investment Recovery Securitization Act (Item #35)

 - The amended bill was read by title, passed by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- HB55 Johnson, Mike MTR VEHICLE/SEAT BELTS
Provides relative to evidence of causation from nonuse of a safety belt (Item #40)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary A.

- HB57 Schexnayder CIVIL/ACTIONS
Enacts the Civil Justice Reform Act of 2020 (Item #40)

 - Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title, passed by a vote of 29 yeas and 9 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- HB62 Zeringue UNEMPLOYMENT COMP
Provides for state income tax withholdings on unemployment compensation benefits (Item #32)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations.

- HB64 Stefanski TAX/GAMING
Levies a state tax on the net revenue of fantasy sports contests (Item #17)

 - Rules suspended. Reported favorably. Rules suspended. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
 - Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

- HB65 Wright EMPLOYMENT
Requires short-term COVID-19 occupational forecasts (Item #15)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations.

- HB68 Deshotel TAX CREDITS
Establishes an income or corporation franchise tax credit for certain broadband coverage providers (Item #31)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

- HB69 Deshotel TAX/SALES-USE-EXEMPT
To provide for a sales and use tax exemption on the sale of certain fiber-optic cables (Item #31)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

- HB70 Jenkins TAX/TAX REBATES
Extends Enterprise Zone Program incentives to essential critical infrastructure workers by authorizing the payment of a one-time hazard pay rebate (Item #18)

 - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

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HCR5	Freeman	LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS	Requests a study of the continuity of government provisions by the house and senate governmental affairs committees, meeting jointly - Reported favorably.
HCR6	Wright	U.S. CONSTITUTION	Calls for a convention to amend the United States Constitution to establish a limitation on terms for members of congress - Reported favorably.
HCR7	Ivey	LEGISLATIVE AGCY/LAW INST	Directs the Louisiana State Law Institute to study the Constitution of Louisiana and make recommendations to the legislature regarding transitional and outdated language that can be removed or changed without affecting the effect of the constitutional provisions - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary A.
HCR11	Fontenot	COASTAL RES/COASTAL ZONE	Memorializes the U.S. Congress and the Louisiana congressional delegation to remove the revenue sharing cap on the Gulf of Mexico Energy Securities Act of 2006 for Gulf producing states and to take such actions as are necessary to rectify the federal revenue sharing inequities between energy producing states - Signed by the President of the Senate.
HCR16	Bourriaque	FUNDS/FUNDING	Memorializes Congress and the Louisiana congressional delegation to clarify the eligibility of freshwater fisheries impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic to receive CARES Act dollars - Signed by the President of the Senate.
HCR17	Carpenter	EMPLOYMENT	Requests certain state agencies and private businesses to recognize the value that justice-involved persons bring to the workforce and society, and to act with the intention to empower, train, and employ such individuals - Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations.
HCR23	Bagley	COMMENDATIONS	Commend Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center at Shreveport for its extraordinary response to the COVID-19 pandemic - Read by title and concurred in by a vote of 37 yeas and 0 nays. Ordered returned to the House.
HCR24	Bagley	SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH	Designates Sunday, July 26, 2020, as Americans with Disabilities Act Awareness Day in Louisiana - Read by title and concurred in by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays. Ordered returned to the House.
