HB203 Huval SUNSET LAW

Provides relative to the re-creation of the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB213 Miguez MUSEUMS

Provides relative to the Louisiana Military Hall of Fame and Museum

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB246 Coussan HUNTING/LICENSES

Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to certify "organizations involved in charitable hunting and fishing activities" and waives license fees for such organizations

HB251 Hilferty EARLY CHILDHOOD

Recreates the Early Childhood Care and Education Commission

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.

HB263 Huval DRUGS/PRESCRIPTION

Provides for insurance coverage of step therapy or fail first protocols

- Received in the Senate. Read first time by title and placed on the Calendar for a second reading.

HB290 Bishop, S. ELECTIONS/COMMISSIONERS

Prohibits the disclosure of addresses and telephone numbers of election commissioners

- Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs.

HB296 Illg INSURANCE/POLICIES

Provides for cancellation of a policy by the insured party

- Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

HB312 Miller, D. DENTISTRY/DENTISTS

Exempts retired volunteer dentists from continuing education requirements

- Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Health and Welfare.

HB328 Freeman TAX/SALES-USE, LOCAL-EXEM

Authorizes an exemption from local sales taxes for feminine hygiene products and diapers

HB330 Lyons HEALTH/MEDICAL TREATMENT

Adds chronic pain associated with fibromyalgia to the set of conditions qualifying a patient for treatment with medical marijuana

HB455 LaCombe DRUGS/CONTROLLED  
Authorizes recommendation of medical marijuana by physicians for patients in hospice or palliative care

Provides relative to a property exchange between the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and the United States Fish and Wildlife Service

- HCR45 Hodges HIGHER EDUCATION  
Requests that the Board of Regents, in consultation with the public postsecondary education management boards, study issues and compile data relative to faculty at public postsecondary education institutions  
- Read by title and concurred in by a vote of 33 yeas and 0 nays. Ordered returned to the House.
- HCR53 Stagni EXCEPTIONAL PERSONS  
Requests a study concerning a voluntary registry of persons with autism and other developmental disabilities for use by law enforcement professionals  
- Read second time by title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary B.
- HCR66 Bishop, S. TAX/CORP FRANCHISE  
Suspends the lower tier of the corporation franchise tax levied on domestic and foreign corporations and the initial tax levied on certain business entities subject to the corporate franchise tax  
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.
- HCR69 Wright ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT  
Creates a task force to study how to best capitalize on Louisiana's international trade potential
