Prohibits the expenditure of any state funds where a public official is mentioned in any commercial advertisement.

- SB 118 THEUNISSEN STUDENTS
Requires the transfer of student education records within 10 working days of a written request by an educational facility and removes authority to withhold a student's grades under certain circumstances. (gov sig)

- SB 136 LENTINI MUNICIPALITIES
Authorizes the governing authorities of municipalities to propose an ordinance to provide for term limitations or for voters to propose by petition, and for voter approval.

- SB 212 IRONS BESE
Authorizes local school systems to offer instruction in personal financial management to students, provided such instruction is integrated into an existing course of study. (gov sig)

Expands eligibility of the State Employees Group Benefits Program to include active and retired employees of the Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission. (gov sig)

Requires license issuing officer to deliver a summary of the covenant marriage laws
