- SB 28 LENTINI ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Requires compliance with night work provisions on highway projects where DOTD has found night work feasible in order to qualify for contract incentives to construct expeditiously.

- SB 74 CAIN GAMING  
Prohibits truck stop casinos from installing automatic teller machines. (gov sig)

Provides relative to certain duties of the State Fire Marshal. (gov sig)

SB 647 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for the membership of the board of commissioners of the Bayou Blue Fire Protection District if the district is extended into Lafourche Parish. (gov sig)

SB 651 HINES EMPLOYMENT  
Prohibits discrimination in employment due to genetic information.

SB 655 DEAN ANIMALS  
Provides for the adoption and donation of unclaimed horses. (gov sig)

SB 659 B JONES TAX/TAXATION  
Interrupts the running of prescription for failure to file any

tax return, rather than just income and franchise tax returns.

- SB 668 B JONES REVENUE DEPARTMENT  
Authorizes the Department of Revenue and a taxpayer to agree to project an assessment by the use of sampling procedures conforming to generally recognized sampling techniques.(gov sig)  
Reported favorably. (14,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 669 B JONES TAX/TAXATION  
Creates a rule to cease business for the secretary of the Department of Revenue to use to collect final assessments and court judgments of sales and withholding tax collected from others. (7/1/01)

- SB 674 B JONES REVENUE DEPARTMENT

Creates the Broussard Environmental Service and Enhancement District within Lafayette Parish.

SB 1006 HOYT PUBLIC BUILDINGS/GROUNDS  
Authorizes the Vermilion Parish Police Jury to lease a portion of a public building to the previous owner of the building.

SB 1028 MCPHERSON HEALTH CARE  
Authorizes information relative to conviction of certain acts committed by certain nonlicensed persons or licensed ambulance personnel be provided to certain employers pursuant to a criminal history check.

SB 1031 FONTENOT MOTOR VEHICLES  
Changes the maximum storage cost of a vehicle left unclaimed at a repair shop from \$10 per day to the maximum charge set by the Public Service Commission for towing facilities.

SB 1035 BAJOIE SCHOOLS  
Authorizes youth development and assistance programs for elementary students at risk of having disciplinary problems and requires parental involvement in such programs. (gov sig)

SB 1048 HOYT CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE  
Provides for the classification of analogues of certain drugs as controlled dangerous substances.

SB 1053 BEAN OWNERSHIP  
Provides for the transfer of ownership of assets held in a joint account.

SB 1054 THEUNISSEN MOTOR VEHICLES  
Provides that a load of dirt or sand being transported within a certain municipality at a speed exceeding 25 m.p.h does not have to be covered.

Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to exchange title to certain property in Ouachita Parish.

HB 341 DURAND CHILDREN/SUPPORT  
Extends the child support obligation to certain majors

HB 345 KENNARD RETIREMENT/STATE POLICE  
Adds one surviving spouse of a deceased member to the board of trustees who is elected at large by a vote of all active and retired members

Creates the Sex Offender Registry Technology Fund
