Authorizes physician assistants-certified to prescribe and administer certain drugs and medical devices under certain concitions and to provide for the duties and meetings of the physician assistants advisory committee. (7/1/01)

- SB 50 MARIONNEAUX WORKERS' COMPENSATION  
Provides relative to maximum attorney fees.

Authorizes coroner to pronounce death based on certain information received.

- SB 191 MICHOT MOTOR VEHICLES  
Authorizes an additional hang tag for a mobility impaired person dependent on parents who are divorced and living in separate households.

Provides for investment of funds in Medicaid Trust Fund for the Elderly.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 512 SCHEDLER FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides for investment of funds by political subdivisions.
