- SB 347 ELLINGTON FUNDS/FUNDING

SB 627 MICHOT CONTRACTORS
Provides relative to exemptions to the residential building contractors licensing law.
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 629 MICHOT CONTRACTORS
Reduces peremptive period for actions against certain contractors.
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.

SB 634 ULLO CAMPAIGN FINANCE
Authorizes PAC's to expend campaign funds for administrative costs and operating expenses.
Read by title and finally passed, 32 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 635 HAINKEL LEGISLATORS
Provides relative to legislative financial disclosure reports.
Rules suspended; reported favorably.

SB 645 ULLO PUBLIC NUISANCES
Reduces the waiting period authorized for property owners to clean up property which is overgrown.

SB 647 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Provides for the membership of the board of commissioners of the Bayou Blue Fire Protection District if the district is extended into Lafourche Parish. (gov sig)

SB 680 MCPHERSON PUBLIC PROPERTY
Authorizes the Board of Commissioners of the Red River, Atchafalaya, and Bayou Boeuf Levee District to exchange title to certain properties in Rapides Parish with the Hemphill Star Church and Hemphill Star Cemetery.

Reduces the annual non-resident saltwater fishing license from \$50 to \$30.
