Provides that a lifetime hunting license may be used in lieu of obtaining a wildlife management area hunting permit.  
Designated a duplicate of HB 1430.  
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 11 THEUNISSEN FUNDS/FUNDING  
Establishes the process for legislative approval of plans for expending money from the Educational Excellence Funds. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 24 MCPHERSON MOTOR VEHICLES  
Requires motor vehicles to be removed from any roadway after being involved in an accident.  
Read by title and finally passed, 29 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 28 LENTINI ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Requires compliance with night work provisions on highway projects where DOTD has found night work feasible in order to qualify for contract incentives to construct expeditiously.

- SB 52 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS  
Provides a formula for the calculation of savings resulting from the elimination of Gayle pay and the revision of sabbatical leave provisions. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 27 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 77 MCPHERSON STATE OFFICIALS  
Prohibits the expenditure of any state funds where a public official is mentioned in any commercial advertisement.  
Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 104 ULLO CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Provides a criminal penalty for executing a false statement regarding the need to take another person into protective custody.  
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 105 ULLO CORONERS  
Provides relative to fixing fees and expenses for medical examinations prior to commitment.

- SB 136 LENTINI MUNICIPALITIES  
Authorizes voter approved municipal ordinances relative to the issue of term limitations.  
Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- SB 148 ULLO CORONERS  
Authorizes physician coroner to pronounce death based on certain information received.  
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 168 MCPHERSON HUNTERS/HUNTING  
Constitutional amendment to preserve the freedom to hunt, fish and trap subject to reasonable regulation, restriction or prohibition imposed pursuant to law. (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Rules suspended; reported with amendments.
- SB 211 IRONS INSURERS  
Requires health insurers to cover certain medically prescribed

contraceptives and contraceptive services. (10/1/01)  
Read by title and failed to pass, 16 yeas and 17 nays.  
Notice of reconsideration.

- SB 212 IRONS BESE  
Authorizes local school systems to offer instruction in personal financial management to students, provided such instruction is integrated into an existing course of study. (gov sig)

- SB 221 HINES ETHICS  
Provides for an exception from the Ethics Code to allow former city/parish school board members to contract with, be employed by, or be appointed by such board to any school building level position with such board which requires a teacher's certificate.  
Read by title and finally passed, 32 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 223 M SMITH JUDGES  
Constitutional amendment to authorize impeachment of judges by the legislature. (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Rules suspended, recalled from committee.  
Withdrawn from the files of the Senate.
- SB 225 M SMITH GAMING  
Constitutional amendment to prohibit any referendum elections in a certain parish to allow or expand gaming by legislative act. (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Read by title and failed to pass, 16 yeas and 17 nays.

- SB 230 FONTENOT GROUP INSURANCE  
Expands eligibility of the State Employees Group Benefits Program to include active and retired employees of the Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission. (gov sig)

- SB 241 CAMPBELL POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS

- SB 249 DUPRE EXPROPRIATION  
Authorizes the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government to expropriate by a declaration of taking.

- SB 251 DUPRE EXPROPRIATION  
Authorizes the Consolidation Terrebonne Parish Waterworks District No. 1 to expropriate by a declaration of taking.

- SB 293 LENTINI CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Authorizes filings of pleadings and documents to clerks of court offices by facsimile transmission in criminal cases as permitted by the policy of each clerk of court.  
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 300 CHAISSON LOCAL OFFICIALS  
Requires a minimum salary paid by the parish governing authority for certain justices of the peace and constables.  
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 306 C FIELDS CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Provides for DNA testing at the request of persons confined, paroled, or otherwise released due to conviction or pleading guilty to certain offenses and requires that district attorneys release evidence for such testing.  
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 322 HEITMEIER TELECOMMUNICATIONS  
Provides for a "do not call" listing for residential telephone

subscribers who do not wish to receive telephone solicitations.  
(gov sig)

- SB 338 DUPRE HUNTERS/HUNTING  
Provides for a disabled hunting license. (2/3-CA7s2.1)  
Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- SB 339 DUPRE MOTOR VEHICLES  
Provides for a medical hardship appeal of a driver's license suspension.  
Rules suspended; reported with amendments.
- SB 345 DARDENNE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Creates the crime of cyberstalking.  
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 359 MCPHERSON WILDLIFE RESOURCES  
Establishes the Hunting and Fishing Advisory Education Council.  
Rules suspended; reported with amendments.
- SB 362 DUPRE SEINES/NETS  
Provides relative to the size of certain nets used in shrimping.  
Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- SB 363 DUPRE DWI  
Reduces the blood alcohol level for certain DWI offenses to 0.08 percent. (gov sig)

- SB 400 MALONE STUDENTS  
Includes the parish of Bossier in the truancy and assessment and service center pilot program.

- SB 409 DUPRE MOTOR VEHICLES  
Requires child passenger restraint systems, according to age and weight, for children being transported in motor vehicles. (1/1/02)

- SB 416 MCPHERSON PUBLIC PROPERTY  
Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and the commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry to exchange certain properties.

 Provides for hunting and fishing license fees charged nonresident students in state institutions of higher education.

 Provides for the designation of the chairman of the Louisiana Auctioneers Licensing Board by the governor. (gov sig)

SB 495 BOISSIERE SALES  
 Provides for the sale of surplus movable goods at online auction. (7/1/01)  
 Rules suspended; reported with amendments.

SB 506 SCHEDLER SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
 Authorizes certain hospital service district commissions to sell and convey immovable property if such property does not exceed 30% of the total appraised value of its immovable assets.

SB 510 SCHEDLER PUBLIC RECORDS  
 Provides relative to exceptions to the Public Records Act.

 Provides the statewide cancer registry program.
