

- SB 16 HOLLIS COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS
Prohibits the use of false, misleading, deceptive, and hidden information in advertisements. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))
Rules suspended.
Called from the calendar. Read by title, withdrawn from the files of the Senate.
- SB 74 CAIN GAMING
Prohibits truck stop casinos from installing automatic teller machines. (gov sig)
Read by title and finally passed, 29 yeas and 6 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 119 THEUNISSEN PUBLIC CONTRACTS
Provides for retainage bonds in public works contracts. (gov sig)
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 154 HAINKEL CORONERS
Permits, rather than requires, the state to pay supplemental compensation to coroners.
Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- SB 173 JOHNSON TAX/TAXATION
Constitutional amendment to require a two-thirds vote to enact exemptions and exclusions from local sales and use taxes. (2/3-CA13s1(A))
Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 201 W FIELDS TEACHERS
Allows a teacher to submit a request for extended sick leave and document its medical necessity within 3 days after the teacher's return. (gov sig)
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 205 W FIELDS ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT
Requires Department of Environmental Quality to publish advertisements in the newspaper which is closest in proximity to the public hearings. (gov sig)
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 206 GAUTREUX ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT
Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to publish public notices in the newspaper closest to the community affected by the permitted activity. (gov sig)
Read by title and finally passed as amended 36 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House.
Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 220 HINES WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Excludes landmen from workers' compensation coverage.
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 261 CAMPBELL RAILROADS
Provides for the maintenance of railroad rights-of-way. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 263 LENTINI CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
Requires the dismissal of charges, except for violent crimes, against an unrestorable incompetent defendant, on the expiration date of his maximum possible sentence if convicted or five years from his arrest, whichever is sooner.
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 265 LENTINI CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
Adds definitions for mental disease and mental defect in insanity proceedings.
Read by title and finally passed, 36 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 295 MICHOT COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS
Enacts the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act. (7/1/02)
Designated a duplicate of HB 888.

- SB 322 HEITMEIER TELECOMMUNICATIONS
Provides for a "do not call" listing for residential telephone subscribers who do not wish to receive telephone solicitations. (gov sig)

Provides for limitation on the exemption of certain sole proprietors who elect out of workers' compensation coverage. (gov sig)

Requires determination of competency to proceed prior to mental examination ordered relative to a plea of insanity.

Provides for funding of a program for political subdivision and non-profit entity capital outlay projects.

- SB 392 LENTINI COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS
Replaces the requirement to obtain a buyer's identification card with a requirement that a \$1 recordation charge be assessed and collected on each transaction. (7/1/01) (2/3CA7s2.1(A))

Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 400 MALONE STUDENTS
Includes the parish of Bossier in the truancy and assessment and service center pilot program.

- SB 438 DARDENNE TOPS
Lowers the required ACT score for a TOPS-Tech award from 19 to 17, beginning with the 2000-2001 high school graduates. (gov sig)

- SB 451 BOISSIERE PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET
Provides with respect to the Parochial Employees' Retirement System. (1/1/02)

- SB 453 MICHOT CIVIL PROCEDURE
Requires an adverse party to file any opposition documents, if any are filed, in a summary judgment proceeding at least four days before the hearing.

Provides the electronic government structure for the executive branch of state government. (7/1/01)

- SB 494 HINES CHILDREN
Provides for the legitimate status of a child conceived and born within two years of the death of the husband of the mother.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 34 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 508 SCHEDLER FUNDS/FUNDING
Provides for investment of funds in Medicaid Trust Fund for the Elderly.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 34 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 559 LENTINI MOTOR VEHICLES
Provides for the suspension of driver's license for 1 year for 2nd and subsequent DWI offenses without hardship or ignition interlock device exceptions and requires installation of such devices on his vehicle at the conclusion of suspension.

SB 620 HAINKEL FUNDS/FUNDING
 Authorizes the La. Tuition Trust Authority to initiate and service student loans and to issue revenue bonds to do so. (gov sig)

 Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 627 MICHOT CONTRACTORS
 Provides relative to exemptions to the residential building contractors licensing law.
 Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.

SB 643 LENTINI MALPRACTICE
 Provides relative to medical malpractice liability.
 Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.

SB 651 HINES EMPLOYMENT
 Prohibits discrimination in employment due to genetic information.
 Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 655 DEAN ANIMALS
 Provides for the adoption and donation of unclaimed horses. (gov sig)
 Read by title and finally passed, 31 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 666 B JONES REVENUE DEPARTMENT
 Expands the current authority of the secretary of the Department of Revenue to contract with private collection agencies to include in-state uncollectibles. (gov sig)
 Rules suspended, reported by substitute.

SB 679 HOLLIS BANKS/BANKING
 Provides for law applicable to certain interstate banking activities.
 Received from the House without amendments.

SB 681 HAINKEL PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS
 Provides relative to the Millennium Port Authority. (gov sig)
 Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
 Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 687 HEITMEIER ROADS/HIGHWAYS
 Provides for compensating certain property owners affected by the addition of a down ramp exit from the Crescent City Connection Bridge. (gov sig)
 Rules suspended; reported with amendments.

SB 693 HOYT ROADS/HIGHWAYS
 Provides for the removal of illegal objects in public rights-of-way and penalties for violations. (2/3-CAS2.1(A))
 Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
 Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 694 HOYT TAX/TAXATION
 Authorizes all Enrolled Agents licensed by the U. S. Department of the Treasury to represent taxpayers in administrative matters.
 Rules suspended; reported favorably.

SB 695 HOYT FUNDS/FUNDING
 Deletes minimum interest rate requirement for certain certificates of deposit.
 Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 702 DARDENNE SCHOOLS
 Requires make-up days when school board closes school as the result of school employees threatening or failing to appear for work. (gov sig)
 Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 718 HOYT SPECIAL DISTRICTS
 Creates the Vermilion Parish Economic Development District. (gov sig)
 Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
 Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 750 SCHEDLER CIVIL PROCEDURE
 Authorizes self-insured health care provider to be removed from petition following property executed released and settlement of claim. (gov sig)

read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- SB 757 SCHEDLER MEDICAID
Establishes the Medicaid School-Based Administrative Claiming Trust Fund (gov sig)

Creates the Drought Protection Trust Fund.

- SB 764 DARDENNE SCHOOLS
Continues applicability of provisions concerning promotion of certain school employees in certain school districts. (gov sig)

Establishes a program of universal early childhood education and care classes for four-year olds in any public school system that wishes to participate. (gov sig)

- SB 778 DARDENNE ADMINISTRATION DIVISION
Provides for the disposition of non-productive property. (gov sig)

- SB 781 HINES HEALTH CARE
Provides for the Louisiana Children's Health Insurance Program. (gov sig)

Creates Options 5A and 5B with 50% benefit for surviving spouse and increases contributions to pay cost of benefit. (7/1/01)
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 817 BOISSIERE FIREFIGHTERS RETIREMENT
Increases the allowable amount to be invested in equities by the Firefighters' Pension and Relief Fund in the city of New Orleans.

- SB 818 BOISSIERE FIREFIGHTERS RETIREMENT
Increases the accrual rate of retirement benefits for members with 20 or more years of service.

- SB 838 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS
Authorizes merger of all employees of any municipal police department that are employed in positions that are defined within a Fire and Police Civil Service classification. (7/1/01)

Removes the age limitation for members with twenty or more years of service for purposes of determining benefits eligibility.

Reduces the annual non-resident saltwater fishing license from \$50 to \$30.

Authorizes the use of deposit guaranty bonds as security for deposits of state funds.

Changes the maximum storage cost of a vehicle left unclaimed at a repair shop from \$10 per day to the maximum charge set by the Public Service Commission for towing facilities.

- SB 1032 MALONE PUBLIC BUILDINGS/GROUNDS
Authorizes certain school boards to rename stadiums and buildings. (gov sig)
Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 1035 BAJOIE SCHOOLS
Authorizes youth development and assistance programs for elementary students at risk of having disciplinary problems and requires parental involvement in such programs. (gov sig)

Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to exchange certain property located in Lafayette Parish with Adrian Vega.

Prohibits insurers from discriminating against employers based on the securing of workers' compensation obligation.

Authorizes military service time as creditable service time in certain retirement systems.

- SB 1102 C FIELDS HOUSING
Provides minimum requirements for an approved material used in the installation of a pier foundation for a manufactured or mobile home.

Recognizes Monday, May 7, 2001 as Louisiana Legislative Fitness Day.
Introduced in the Senate. Read by title, rules suspended, adopted.
- SCR 17 C FIELDS CIVIL SERVICE
Urges and requests the Dept. of Civil Service to accept any college credit or degrees from schools which are a part of the La. Community and Technical College System and have been accredited by the Council of Occupational Education.
Read by title, adopted by the vote of 31 yeas and 0 nays and ordered to the House.
- SCR 57 SCHEDLER COMMITTEE STUDIES
Establishes the Task Force on Local Funding Certification to study and make recommendations on resources available for use as funds for which federal matching funds are allowed.
