Provides for retainage bonds in public works contracts. (gov sig)
Read by title and finally passed, 24 yeas and 11 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 138 ELLINGTON ETHICS
Provides an exception from the Ethics Code to allow an elected official to continue certain compensational services for any person who has a contractual business or financial relationship with his agency.
Read by title and finally passed, 26 yeas and 5 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 154 HAINKEL CORONERS
Permits, rather than requires, the state to pay supplemental compensation to coroners.

- SB 216 CAIN PUBLIC SFTY/CORRECT DEPT
Creates and establishes a pilot program to determine the cost effectiveness of transferring certain geriatric inmates to private nursing homes.

Excludes landmen from workers' compensation coverage.

Provides for the maintenance of railroad rights-of-way. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))

- SB 277 DARLENNE INSURERS
Requires health insurance policies to provide coverage for services rendered by registered nurse first assistants.

- SB 331 MICHOT WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Provides for limitation on the exemption of certain sole proprietors who elect out of workers' compensation coverage. (gov sig)

SB 1029 C FIELDS FISCAL CONTROLS
Authorizes the use of deposit guaranty bonds as security for deposits of state funds.

Changes the maximum storage cost of a vehicle left unclaimed at a repair shop from \$10 per day to the maximum charge set by the Public Service Commission for towing facilities.

SB 1032 MALONE PUBLIC BUILDINGS/GROUNDS

SB 1038 C D JONES GAMING

Increases fees collected by the Opelousas' city court marshall and delays application of educational requirements for the marshall. (gov sig)

- SB 1041 SCHEDLER MUNICIPAL POL EMPS RET
Authorizes members of the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System with a vested military benefit to purchase credit for that military service.

- SB 1048 HOYT CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE
Provides for the classification of analogues of certain drugs as controlled dangerous substances.

- SB 1053 BEAN OWNERSHIP
Provides for the transfer of ownership of assets held in a joint account.

- SB 1054 THEUNISSEN MOTOR VEHICLES
Provides that a load of dirt or sand being transported within a certain municipality at a speed exceeding 25 m.p.h does not have to be covered.

- SB 1055 BARHAM PUBLIC LANDS
Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to exchange title to certain property in Ouachita Parish.
Read by title and finally passed, 38 years and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 1060 C ROMERO PUBLIC LANDS
Authorizes the secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to exchange certain property located in Lafayette Parish with Adrian Vega.
Read by title and finally passed, 38 years and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 1061 C ROMERO PUBLIC LANDS
Authorizes the state land office to sell its one-third undivided interest in a certain parcel of land in St. Martin Parish to the owners of the remaining two-thirds interest.
