- SB 108 HINES HEALTH CARE  
Creates the Louisiana Seniors Pharmacy Assistance Program. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 113 ELLINGTON SCHOOLS  
Changes references in the high school career options program from a vocational major to a career major and provides for program reporting requirements. (gov sig)  
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 150 SCHEDLER MENTAL HEALTH  
Provides for administering medication to a patient admitted to a psychiatric treatment facility under certain emergency conditions without his consent.  
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 151 SCHEDLER MENTAL HEALTH  
Provides for an area management structure in the office of mental health. (gov sig)  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.

- SB 818 BOISSIERE FIREFIGHTERS RETIREMENT  
Increases the accrual rate of retirement benefits for members with 20 or more years of service.

- SB 844 BOISSIERE FIREFIGHTERS RETIREMENT  
Provides the option of selecting deferred retirement option plan (DROP) participation as well as a later initial lump sum benefit to members of the Firefighters' Pension and Relief Fund in the city of New Orleans.
