- SB 39 MCPHERSON LOCAL OFFICIALS
Provides that the town of Woodworth shall appoint rather than elect their chief of police.
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 52 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS
Provides a formula for the calculation of savings resulting from the elimination of Gayle pay and the revision of sabbatical leave provisions. (gov sig)
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 98 HAINKEL WATER/WATERWAYS
Changes the criminal penalties for violations of the Louisiana Scenic Rivers Act.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 37 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House.
Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 114 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS
Adds certain school administrators as eligible to earn the NBPTS certification salary adjustment of \$5,000 and extends the period of eligibility for such adjustment from certified by 7-1-02 to certified by 7-1-07. (gov sig)

- SB 115 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS
Requires all schools to have a written crisis management and response plan in place by 1/1/02. (gov sig)

- SB 162 FONTENOT SCHOOLS
Constitutional amendment to recognize certain city, parish, and other local public school systems and to require the legislature to provide by law for the means by which to establish different systems than those recognized. (2/3-CA13s1(A))

Read by title as amended, and failed to pass 22 yeas, and 11 nays. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 176 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Repeals State Employees' Retirement System's disability rehabilitation program. (gov sig)

Increases the term of office for Tangipahoa Water District's Board of Commissioners.

Prohibit the expenditure of campaign funds for the payment of certain fines, fees, and penalties
Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB 382 MARTINY PRISONERS/GOOD TIME
Provides with respect to good time earned by prisoners in parish prisons and multiparish facilities
Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB 389 SCALISE STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHIP
Prohibits a TOPS award recipient from being restricted or otherwise delayed in first using the award due to the student having graduated from high school in less than four years
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB 404 LEBLANC PHYSICAL THERAPISTS
Increases maximum amount for fees assessed by the Louisiana Board of Physical Therapy Examiners
Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB 405 ODINET DISTRICTS/WATERWORKS
Provides for the retention of unclaimed or abandoned water deposits by water and sewerage commissions in St. Bernard Parish rather than parishes with a population range of 65,000 - 67,000
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB 410 K CARTER STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHIP
Provides TOPS award eligibility for certain students obtaining high school equivalency diplomas issued by the state Dept. of Education on or after July 1, 2000
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB 419 ERDEY WORKERS COMPENSATION
Increases benefit limits for each surviving parent from \$20,000 to \$50,000
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB 422 FARRAR CRIME/THEFT
Creates the crime of theft of motor vehicle fuel
Rules suspended; reported favorably.

HB 423 FAUCHEUX PUBLIC LANDS/STATE
Authorizes the transfer or lease of certain state property in St. John the Baptist Parish from the Department of Transportation and Development to the descendants of and buyers from the original owner
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB 430 LANCASTER CAMPAIGN FINANCE DISCLOS
Repeals provision requiring an out-of-state political committee exempted from campaign finance recordkeeping and disclosure requirements to file copies of portions of FEC reports in Louisiana elections
Signed by the President of the Senate.

HB 458 CRANE SCHOOLS
Increases the minimum number of instructional days per school year in public elementary and secondary schools from 175 to 177
Received in the Senate. Rules suspended read first and second time by title and referred to the committee on EDUCATION.

HB 478 MORRISH DISTRICTS/DRAINAGE
