Exempts used motor vehicle dealers licensed prior to January 1, 2002, from certain educational seminar requirements and requires Notice House adopted Conference Committee report.
- SB 50 MARIONNEAUX WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Provides relative to maximum attorney fees.

- SB 53 LAMBERT MOTOR VEHICLES
Authorizes a special prestige plate for Beta Sigma Phi. (7/1/01)
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 109 HINES NURSES
Provides for membership of the Nursing Supply and Demand Commission.
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 110 THOMAS MOTOR VEHICLES
Authorizes motorcycles to have a special prestige license plate for veterans.
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 119 THEUNISSEN PUBLIC CONTRACTS
Provides for retainage bonds in public works contracts. (gov sig)
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 152 SCHEDLER MOTOR VEHICLES
Creates the Louisiana Nursing Foundation special prestige license plate.
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 176 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS
Repeals LASERS disability rehabilitation program and provides for conversion of disability benefit to regular retirement in Teachers Retirement System. (gov sig)
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 177 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS
Provides for changes in definitions for "actuarial interest," "base pay," "employer," "job appointment," "prior service," and "spouse" and provides clarification of part-time service and statutes that apply to disability. (gov sig)

Authorizes the Interim Emergency Board to make certain changes to capital outlay projects in a capital outlay act upon approval of the legislature by mail ballot. (7/1/01)

SB 217 MCPHERSON CRIME/PUNISHMENT
Creates the crime of theft of the assets of an aged or disabled person and provides for penalties.
Received from the House with amendments.

SB 230 FONTENOT GROUP INSURANCE
Expands eligibility of the State Employees Group Benefits Program to include active and retired employees of the Louisiana Naval War Memorial Commission. (gov sig)
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.

SB 239 C D JONES CRIME/PUNISHMENT
Repeals minimum mandatory sentences for non-violent crimes.
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.

SB 240 ELLINGTON FUNDS/FUNDING
Constitutional amendment to authorize the investment of up to thirty-five percent of Medicaid Trust Fund for the Elderly in stocks. (2/3-CA13s1(A))
Received from the House with amendments.

SB 244 MALONE FARMING
Constitutional amendment to authorize the legislature by law to assist certain farmers and provide funds therefor.
(2/3-CA13s1(A))
Received from the House with amendments.

SB 247 SCHEDLER SCHOOLS
Provides a salary supplement for certain school counselors who have met the requirements and acquired the NCSC credential. (gov sig.)
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.

SB 252 CRAVINS CIVIL SERVICE
Authorizes the members of the Opelousas Fire and Police Civil Service Board to receive \$25 dollars per meeting not to exceed two meetings per month. (gov sig)
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.

SB 254 B JONES TRUSTS
Provides for who may be a trustee of a trust.
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.

SB 263 LENTINI CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
Requires the dismissal of charges, except for violent crimes, against an unrestorable incompetent defendant, on the expiration date of his maximum possible sentence if convicted or five years from his arrest, whichever is sooner.
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.

SB 281 LENTINI COURTS
Provides for an increase in certain fees of the 24th Judicial District Court. (gov sig)
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.

SB 283 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS
Authorizes with voter approval, the levy and collection of a parcel fee by School District No. 4 of the parish of Cameron for operating, maintaining and improving the school system including the payment of any debts incurred for such purposes. (gov sig)

SB 289 ULLO PUBLIC SFTY/CORRECT DEPT
Provides exemption to certain capital outlay requirements and certain maximum cost limits for the construction by inmate labor of buildings to house inmate work programs.

SB 300 CHAISSON LOCAL OFFICIALS
Requires a minimum salary paid by the parish governing authority for certain justices of the peace and constables.

SB 314 HEITMEIER INSURERS
Requires health insurers to provide coverage for low protein food products and medical foods for treatment of inherited metabolic diseases.

Provides for the designation of the chairman of the Louisiana Auctioneers Licensing Board by the governor. (gov sig)

SB 500 W FIELDS MOTOR VEHICLES
Provides relative to prestige license plates for public service sororities and fraternities including establishing a fee for the Notice House conferees appointed.

SB 501 FONTENOT MOTOR VEHICLES
Provides for selective service registration of a U.S. male citizen or immigrant, who is at least 18 but less than 26 years of age, upon application for a driver's license. (1/1/02)

Transfers administration of the federal grants for energy assistance and weatherization services for low income persons from the Department of Social Services to the Louisiana Housing Finance Agency. (gov sig)

SB 532 BOISSIERE ASSESSORS RETIREMENT
Authorizes an increase in the employee and employer contribution rate and the accrual rate for the Assessors' Retirement Fund. (7/1/01)

Provides for reimbursement for health care services provided to Medicaid recipients by an advanced practice registered nurse pursuant to a health care cost control program.
