Provides for a state and political subdivision sales tax exemption for literacy organizations. (7/1/02)

- SB 13 DUPRE TAX/TAXATION
Provides a method by which fire departments, fire districts, or fire companies can purchase dyed special fueltax-free, but remit such taxes monthly. (7/1/02)
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 18 C ROMERO TAX EXEMPTIONS
Constitutional amendment to exempt from property tax drilling rigs used exclusively for exploration and development of minerals in OCS waters. (1/1/03) (CA13s1(A))
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 31 B JONES TAX/TAXATION
Provides a procedure for claiming certain tax credits and eliminates the requirement that refunds be made to anyone other than the person or entity which earned the credit. (gov sig)

- SB 32 B JONES TAX/TAXATION
Defines "dealer" to require mail order and Internet vendors to collect the state's sales tax on sales made into Louisiana. (gov sig)

- SB 36 C FIELDS TAX/TAXATION
Creates a special taxing district for the Concord Homeowners Association.
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 39 C ROMERO TAX EXEMPTIONS
Exempts from state and local sales tax, the repair, renovation, or conversion of drilling rigs and equipment used exclusively for exploration and development of minerals in OCS waters. (7/1/02)
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 42 FONTENOT TAX/TAXATION
Authorizes a refundable credit against income tax and corporate franchise tax for the purchase by a taxpayer of specialty apparel items from a 'PIE contractor' which employs inmates to manufacture such apparel. (1/1/03)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 72, nays 28. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 49 B JONES TAX/TAXATION
Provides a method for the collection of amounts of exemptions granted under tax equalization, and manufacturing exemption, and enterprise zone contracts whose terms have been violated. (gov sig)
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 57 THOMAS TAX/SALES
Exempts from local sales tax the sale of prescription drugs (LACHIP); "administration" of drugs" in a physician's office; and authorizes locals to exempt the purchase of such drugs and/or provide for an amnesty for taxes previously paid. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 2. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 60 C D JONES TAX/TAXATION
Authorizes the governing body of a municipality with population exceeding 50,000 but not in excess of 55,000 according to the most recent federal census to levy any form of tax permitted for economic development purposes. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 90, nays 8. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 71 BAJOIE TAX/LOCAL
Exempts the "procurement and administration" of cancer-related

and chemotherapy drugs from local sales tax when administered in a physician's office. (7/1/02)

Signed by the Speaker of the House.

- SB 80 HOLDEN BONDS
Authorizes the issuance of debt financing instruments known as Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicles (GARVEE) by the State Bond Commission. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 104, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 81 C FIELDS TAX/TAXATION
Suspends the exemptions of a taxpayer who holds a tax incentive contract not issued under Art. VII, Sec.21 (F) that does not pay or enter into agreement to pay and related charges under a final non-appealable judgment within 30 days of notice.
Reported favorably. (11,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

- SB 86 ELLINGTON TAX/SALES
Provides for exclusion from state & local sales & use tax for withdrawal, use, distribution, consumption, storage, donation, or disposition of cellular, PCS, or wireless telephones; sale or use of mobile telecommunications services; except retail. (gs)
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 74, nays 28. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SCR 5 IRONS COMMITTEE STUDIES
