

- SB 11 HINES TAX/TAXATION
Provides for a state and political subdivision sales tax exemption for literacy organizations. (7/1/02)
Received from the House without amendments.
- SB 13 DUPRE TAX/TAXATION
Provides a method by which fire departments, fire districts, or fire companies can purchase dyed special fueltax-free, but remit such taxes monthly. (7/1/02)
Received from the House with amendments.
- SB 18 C ROMERO TAX EXEMPTIONS
Constitutional amendment to exempt from property tax drilling rigs used exclusively for exploration and development of minerals in OCS waters. (1/1/03) (CA13s1(A))
Received from the House with amendments.
- SB 31 B JONES TAX/TAXATION
Provides a procedure for claiming certain tax credits and eliminates the requirement that refunds be made to anyone other than the person or entity which earned the credit. (gov sig)
Received from the House with amendments.
- SB 39 C ROMERO TAX EXEMPTIONS
Exempts from state and local sales tax, the repair, renovation, or conversion of drilling rigs and equipment used exclusively for exploration and development of minerals in OCS waters. (7/1/02)
Received from the House with amendments.
- SB 49 B JONES TAX/TAXATION
Provides a method for the collection of amounts of exemptions granted under tax equalization, and manufacturing exemption, and enterprise zone contracts whose terms have been violated. (gov sig)
Received from the House with amendments.
- SB 71 BAJOIE TAX/LOCAL
Exempts the "procurement and administration" of cancer-related and chemotherapy drugs from local sales tax when administered in a physician's office. (7/1/02)
Received from the House without amendments.
- SR 29 M SMITH COMMITTEE STUDIES
Requests the Senate Committee on Agriculture to study and develop a strategy relative to encouraging, promoting, and stimulating agricultural-based economic development projects in Louisiana.

- HB 1 LEBLANC APPROPRIATIONS
Provides for the ordinary operating expenses of state government

Senate floor amendments read and adopted. Read by title and finally passed as amended, 38 yeas and 1 nays; title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB 2 HAMMETT CAPITAL OUTLAY
Provides for the comprehensive capital outlay budget
Rules suspended, reported with amendments. Rules suspended, committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

- HB 31 STELLY TAX/TAXATION
(Constitutional Amendment) Provides for a new limitation on individual income tax rates and prohibits the imposition of state sales and use taxes on certain items
Made special order of the day No. 2 for 6/11.
- HB 36 STELLY TAX/INCOME TAX
Revises the state individual income tax brackets and repeals the deduction for excess federal itemized deductions
Made special order of the day No. 3 for 6/11.
- HB 169 DEWITT TAX/SALES-USE, STATE
Suspends certain exemptions from a portion of the state sales and use tax for the period July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2004

- HB 197 SWILLING TAX/LOCAL
Authorizes a municipality with a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand persons to tax trash dumped in violation of law or ordinance

- HB 199 LEBLANC APPROPRIATIONS/ANCILLARY
Provides for the ancillary expenses of state government
Rules suspended, reported with amendments. Rules suspended, committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB 242 LEBLANC APPROPRIATIONS
Appropriates \$36,500,000 in federal funds to the Department of Labor for deposit into the Employment Security Administration Fund and makes certain appropriations from that fund
Rules suspended.
Read by title and finally passed, 38 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB 244 MORRISH TAX/VEHICLE REGISTRATION
Imposes additional registration tax on light trailers
Notice House rejected Senate amendments, and House conferees appointed.
- HB 266 TOWNSEND TAX/INSURANCE LICENSE

Provides an increase in licensing taxes for the year 2002

Rules suspended.
