Provides for compensation of members of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission. (gov sig)
Reported favorably (15-0) ()
Rules suspended.

- SB 32 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Provides for appointment to the board of commissioners of the Terrebonne Levee and Conservation District if a vacancy occurs.

- SB 33 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Provides for the membership of the board of commissioners of the South Lafourche Levee District.

Provides for prescription of debts due public institutions of higher education in ten years. (gov sig)

Redefines the term "fixed base operator".

- SB 106 C FIELDS COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS
Prohibits a retail business from requiring or obtaining an individual's personal information when transacting a cash sale.

Codifies certain laws concerning the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District.

- SB 310 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Provides with respect to hearing panels for disciplinary panels before the La. Board of Medical Examiners. (gov sig)
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on HEALTH & WELFARE.
- SB 315 SCHEDLER FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Creates the Perfusion Licensure Act to provide for the licensing of medical technicians to practice perfusion. (7/1/03)
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 323 LENTINI ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Requires construction involving lane closures on controlled access interstate highways during off-peak hours.
Reported favorably (11,0) () To be recommitted to the Committee on APPROPRIATIONS.
- SB 339 IRONS MOTOR VEHICLES
Creates the Invest in Children special prestige license plate.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 353 MCPHERSON IDENTITY DATA
Provides for the Office of Motor Vehicles to issue a temporary driver's permit under certain conditions.
Reported favorably. (14,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 357 MCPHERSON MENTAL HEALTH
Dedicates the proceeds from the sale of facilities owned by the office of mental health to the renovation of mental health facilities in the same parish as the facility that has been sold.
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on APPROPRIATIONS.
- SB 364 THEUNISSEN TOPS
Revises the required duration of residency from 24 months prior to graduation to the last two academic years prior to graduation and revises the citizenship requirements. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 365 THEUNISSEN TUITION
Provides for the development and maintenance of a comprehensive state student aid plan that supports the Master Plan for Public Postsecondary Education, subject to approval by Regents. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 366 SCHEDLER ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Provides that retired or disabled firemen and policemen shall have free passage over the Lake Pontchartrain Causeway Bridge.
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 387 SCHEDLER CHILDREN
Authorizes interception of federal tax refunds for child support obligations by support enforcement services of the Department of Social Services.
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 402 FONTENOT ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY
Requires the department to develop new criteria for compliance inspections.
Reported with amendments. (14,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 420 MCPHERSON INSURERS
Provides for Patient's Bill of Rights.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 459 CAIN TOPS
Provides for eligibility for dependent children of certain U.S. armed forces personnel stationed in Louisiana. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 471 HOYT TUITION
Provides for administration of and participation in the START program. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 474 THOMAS INSURANCE DEPARTMENT
Insurance does not include certain trust funds established to pay professional malpractice or public liability claims against members of societies of a statewide hospital association.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 483 SCHEDLER ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
Authorizes the Louisiana Retirement Development Commission to purchase, print, and distribute advertisements and promotional items.
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.

SB 542 IRONS HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Provides for a children's comfort care center program to render care to children with life-limiting conditions or diseases. (2/3-CA7s2.1A)
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 554 DUPRE DWI
Provides for the suspension of driver's license for one year for second and subsequent DWI offenses, with no exceptions, and for installation of an ignition interlock device on all the vehicles of an offender for 6 months after such suspensions.
Reported with amendments. (12,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 568 DUPRE FUNDS/FUNDING
Authorizes certain uses for nonrecurring revenues, authorizes certain deposits into the Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fund, and increases the cap on mineral revenues that can be part of the balance in that fund. (7/1/04)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 577 FONTENOT ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT
Authorizes the secretary of DEQ to issue expedited enforcement actions for minor or moderate violations.

SB 578 FONTENOT FUNDS/FUNDING

Requires Bond Commission approval of any agreement that expends state funds as security for any obligation. (7/1/03)

SB 621 MICHOT MOTOR VEHICLES
Changes the \$25 royalty fee for a Camp Woodmen prestige license plate from an annual fee to a one-time fee. (gov sig)

SB 665 HEITMEIER ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates the portion of LA 23 that is in the city of Gretna as the "Mel Ott Parkway".

Changes membership of the board of trustees. (gov sig)
