Exempts a commercial fisherman from having to possess a "mobile food vendor's permit".  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 3 DUPRE FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS  
Authorizes the purchase of an additional fresh products license, to authorize the spouse of a commercial fisherman to sell the catch while the commercial fisherman continues to fish.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 8 GAUTREAU COURTS  
Provides for an additional \$20 court cost for juvenile offender services for the city court of Morgan City.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 31 DUPRE PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS  
Provides for compensation of members of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 32 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for appointment to the board of commissioners of the Terrebonne Levee and Conservation District if a vacancy occurs.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 105, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 33 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for the membership of the board of commissioners of the South Lafourche Levee District.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 105, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 34 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for membership of the board of commissioners of the North Lafourche Conservation, Levee and Drainage District.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 41 MCPHERSON ROADS/HIGHWAYS

Corrects various statutes to reflect the correct name of the Senate Commerce Committee.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 64 M SMITH PRESCRIPTION  
Provides for prescription of debts due public institutions of higher education in ten years. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 78 DARDENNE AIRCRAFT/AVIATION  
Redefines the term "fixed base operator".  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 100 CAIN ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Designates portions of Highway 110 in the town of Merryville as

the "C.E. Buddy Slaydon Memorial Drive."  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,  
yeas 104, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the

SB 208 MARIONNEAUX FARMING  
Provides for issuance of certain special permits to operators of vehicles. (gov sig)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.

SB 214 DUPRE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Const. amend. authorizing certain uses for nonrecurring revenue, authorizing certain deposits into Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fd, and providing for the cap on mineral revenues that can be part of the balance in the fund. (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, was finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 237 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Repeals provisions which require certification by the Department of Health and Hospitals of review agents performing utilization. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 238 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Defines the "facilities" which DHH may declare to be in violation, and provides an administrative appeal process in certain circumstances.  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 253 DARDENNE COURTS  
Provides that any new court cost or fee or increase in an existing court cost or fee first be submitted to the Judicial Council for review and recommendation to the legislature.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 261 HOYT ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Provides that local and parish roads in Vermilion Parish, without exception, shall become public if certain maintenance work is performed on them.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 263 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Re-creates the Department of Health and Hospitals. (6/30/03)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 292 MOUNT CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Authorizes a court to require a defendant to appear in open court for good cause shown.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 305 SCHEDLER MEDICAID  
Requires DHH to create an optional Medicaid program for persons with disabilities to buy-in to Medicaid coverage so they can return to work and maintain eligibility.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 306 SCHEDLER HEALTH SERVICES  
Revises provisions for disciplinary proceedings involving emergency medical personnel.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 310 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Provides with respect to hearing panels for disciplinary panels before the La. Board of Medical Examiners. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 311 SCHEDLER NURSING HOMES  
Provides relative to licensure of nursing facility administrators.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 312 BOISSIERE STATE POLICE RET FUND  
Provides retroactive eligibility for survivor benefits in limited circumstances where surviving spouse was married to decedent for less than two years prior to death. (gov sig)

- SB 331 BAJOIE SECONDHAND DEALERS  
Provides for regulation of "used building component" under the state secondhand dealers and antique dealers law, and requires the reporting of transactions involving "used building components." (gov sig)

Adopts a revised Interstate Compact for Juveniles. (7/1/04)

- SB 339 IRONS MOTOR VEHICLES  
Creates the Invest in Children special prestige license plate.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 3. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 342 BOISSIERE SHERIFFS PEN/RELIEF FUND  
Provides for a one-time cost-of-living adjustment relative to the Sheriffs' Pension and Relief Fund.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 353 MCPHERSON IDENTITY DATA  
Provides for the Office of Motor Vehicles to issue a temporary driver's permit under certain conditions.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 375 SCHEDLER SEX OFFENSES  
Requires any person required to register as a sex offender to notify the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information of any institution of postsecondary education at which he is a student or is employed.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 376 SCHEDLER SEX OFFENSES  
Corrects Sex Offender and Child Predator Registry verification of address penalties.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 402 FONTENOT ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY  
Requires the department to develop new criteria for compliance inspections.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 428 BOISSIERE TEACHERS RETIREMENT  
Provides with respect to contribution limits. (7/1/03)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 440 MOUNT LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR  
Changes certain aspects of the SERVE Commission.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 476 BAJOIE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Creates the crime of theft of a used building component. (gov sig)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 482 CHAISSON VIDEO POKER  
Provides for use of thermal printers in video gaming devices and other alternate means of capturing duplicate information of a ticket voucher.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 513 C D JONES CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Provides that unsecured personal surety may be posted by any qualified state resident.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 522 C D JONES DNA  
Extends post conviction relief period within which to file application for DNA testing and provides relative to indigent defense.  
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on ADMIN CRIM JUSTICE.
- SB 528 C D JONES CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Removes misdemeanor crime of carnal knowledge from the list of crimes the sentences for which may not be diminished for good behavior.

- SB 554 DUPRE DWI  
Provides for the suspension of driver's license for one year for second and subsequent DWI offenses, with no exceptions, and for installation of an ignition interlock device on all the vehicles of an offender for 6 months after such suspensions.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 47, nays 53. Failed to pass.
- SB 568 DUPRE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Authorizes certain uses for nonrecurring revenues, authorizes certain deposits into the Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fund, and increases the cap on mineral revenues that can be part of the balance in that fund. (7/1/04)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call. Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 105, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 577 FONTENOT ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT  
Authorizes the secretary of DEQ to issue expedited enforcement actions for minor or moderate violations.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 94, nays 3. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 591 DARDENNE PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Requires Bond Commission approval of any agreement that expends state funds as security for any obligation. (7/1/03)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 592 SCHEDLER HEALTH CARE  
Revises the Louisiana Tumor Registry.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 612 B JONES MEDICAID  
Re-establishes the Medicaid Estate Recovery Program.  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 621 MICHOT MOTOR VEHICLES  
Changes the \$25 royalty fee for a Camp Woodmen prestige license plate from an annual fee to a one-time fee. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 6. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 634 CAIN GAMING  
Expands the aisles between slot machines to make for a safer passage so that persons do not get hurt should they need to exit because of a fire or other hazard.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 665 HEITMEIER ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Designates the portion of LA 23 that is in the city of Gretna as the "Mel Ott Parkway".  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 672 FONTENOT LIABILITY  
Extends immunity under the Good Samaritan Law to certain emergency service providers. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 686 ULLO LOTTERIES  
Provides mechanism for utilization of lottery terminal to display the "Amber Alert" notification.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 699 ULLO LAW ENFORCEMENT  
Authorizes any law enforcement officer to serve a certified copy of a restraining order or ex parte protective order on any named defendant.

- SB 707 M SMITH FARMING  
Changes the number of times the Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority meets. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 711 MARIONNEAUX CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Creates the crime of fraudulent acquisition of a credit card.

Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

- SB 721 HAINKEL INSURANCE RATES  
Creates a flexible rating process for property and casualty insurance rates.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 729 MCPHERSON ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Authorizes vehicles traveling under special permits to use a portion of I-49 in Rapides Parish as an alternate route for U.S. Hwy 71, U.S. Hwy. 165, and U.S. Hwy. 167.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 732 C ROMERO FISH/FISHING  
Reduces the minimum size mesh for commercial crawfish traps from 3/4 inch to 11/16 of an inch. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 756 HOYT CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Removes from the crimes of simple rape and sexual battery the exception provided if the offender is the spouse of the victim.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 788 MICHOT WORKERS' COMPENSATION  
Repeals sunset provision in catastrophic injury compensation statute.  
Discharged from the committee on LABOR&IND RELATIONS.  
Designated duplicate of HB 1332.  
Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 800 BAJOIE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY  
Provides for redemptive period affecting post-adjudication donation of abandoned or blighted property by parishes and municipalities. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 801 MARIONNEAUX EMPLOYMENT  
Allows certain employers to obtain criminal records of job applicant.  
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on ADMIN CRIM JUSTICE.
- SB 806 JOHNSON WEAPONS  
Requires any entity which sells a firearm to make available to the purchaser secure gun storage or safety devices for such firearm at the time of the sale and authorizes instruction on firearm safety in any public elementary school in the state.  
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on EDUCATION.
- SB 828 BOISSIERE GAMING  
Authorizes slot machine gaming at an eligible live horse racing facility in Orleans Parish, and specifies fund dedications in St. Landry and Bossier parishes.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 829 BARHAM SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for the creation of the Morehouse Parish Lake Commission.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 830 BAJOIE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY  
Authorizes municipalities and parishes to sell certain adjudicated vacant lots by private sale. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 847 ELLINGTON SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Creates a downtown development district in the town of Winnsboro. (gov sig)  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 854 ELLINGTON MOTOR VEHICLES  
Requires the width of the fender, cover, or other device on a motor vehicle that is used to minimize the spray of water, mud, or loose material on a road be at least the width of the tire of the vehicle.

SB 863 DARDENNE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Expands definition of obscenity to include materials electronically communicated over the Internet.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 869 JOHNSON HEALTH CARE  
Prohibits smoking in all areas of the Louisiana Superdome.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 875 MOUNT CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Increases penalties for the crimes of aggravated assault upon a peace officer with a firearm and aggravated assault with a firearm.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 889 HAINKEL PUBLIC EMPLOYEES  
Provides for removal of public employees for conviction of a felony. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 902 BAJOIE IMMOVABLE PROPERTY  
Authorizes municipalities and parishes to sell certain adjudicated vacant lots by public or private sale. (gov sig)  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 923 HOYT FRAUD  
Provides for the Uniform Fraudulent Transfer Act.  
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on CIVIL LAW&PROCEDURE.

SB 930 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Provides for an extension of the moratorium on the licensure of methadone maintenance clinics and for license revocation.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 953 DARDENNE LEVEES  
Provides for the expansion of legal servitude on the main line levee of the Mississippi River in Ascension, East Baton Rouge, Iberville, and St. James parishes to construct walkways and bike paths.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 105, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

Provides relative to abuse and neglect of adults, hearings and emergency protective orders.

Provides for the membership of the Children's Cabinet and its advisory board, and extends its termination date. (gov sig)

SB 988 MOUNT ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Designates the portion of LA 27 between Houston River Road and LA 12 in Calcasieu Parish as the "Horace Lynn Jones Memorial Highway".  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 990 HINES HEALTH/ACC INSURANCE  
Provides for the classification of certain types of cancer as occupational diseases or infirmities connected with the duties of a firefighter.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 1025 DARDENNE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides authority to securitize the entire income stream from the tobacco settlement. (7/1/03)

Provides for obtaining permits for alcoholic beverages. (gov sig)
