

- SB 2 DUPRE FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Exempts a commercial fisherman from having to possess a "mobile food vendor's permit".
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 3 DUPRE FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Authorizes the purchase of an additional fresh products license, to authorize the spouse of a commercial fisherman to sell the catch while the commercial fisherman continues to fish.
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 27 HAINKEL HUNTERS/HUNTING
Prohibits the use of aircraft for hunting, shooting or taking of wild turkey or white-tailed deer.
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 31 DUPRE PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS
Provides for compensation of members of the Greater Lafourche Port Commission. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 32 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Provides for appointment to the board of commissioners of the Terrebonne Levee and Conservation District if a vacancy occurs.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 33 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Provides for the membership of the board of commissioners of the South Lafourche Levee District.
Notice of Senate rejecting House amendments.

- SB 35 GAUTREAUX FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Authorizes the department to disqualify applicants for renewal of the fresh products license.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 38 IRONS CURRICULA
Requires the free enterprise curriculum to include instruction in personal finance beginning with the 2004-2005 school year. (gov sig)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 41 MCPHERSON ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Provides for owners of property necessary for highway rights-of-way to apply for early acquisition of the property by DOTD.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 49 DUPRE FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Authorizes the purchase of a four-year wholesale/retail dealer's license and a four-year transport license.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 101, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 50 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS
Eliminates caps on teacher and support person of the year awards and provides for school board approval.
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 55 C FIELDS AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE
Prohibits insurers from canceling an automobile insurance policy under certain circumstances.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 56 C FIELDS INSURERS
Prohibits certain uses of credit information in establishing rates for personal insurance.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 63 HOLLIS SENATE
Corrects various statutes to reflect the correct name of the Senate Commerce Committee.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 104, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 68 M SMITH LOCAL OFFICIALS
Provides that the chief of police for the Village of Dry Prong be appointed rather than elected.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 83 THEUNISSEN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT
Re-creates the Department of Education and its agencies.
(6/30/03)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 100 CAIN ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates portions of Highway 110 in the town of Merryville as the "C.E. Buddy Slaydon Memorial Drive."
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 101 CAIN ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates a portion of Highway 109 and 389 in Beauregard Parish as the "Frank Hennigan Memorial Drive."
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 109 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Codifies certain laws concerning the Bayou Lafourche Freshwater District.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 112 THEUNISSEN EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY
Allows distinguished educators to extend their employment up to 6 years at certain low performing schools. (gov sig)
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 113 DUPRE MOTOR VEHICLES
Requires the Dept. of Public Safety and Correction to suspend for 12 months the driver's license of a person guilty of a hit-and-run violation if the accident resulted in death or serious bodily injury.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 116 DARDENNE AGED PERSONS
Requires DSS to promulgate rules to require adult residential care homes to provide for residents during times of emergency and natural disasters.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 122 DUPRE SHRIMP/SHRIMPING
Authorizes the use of butterfly and bottom nets in Grand Pass.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 126 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS
Increases membership on the State Advisory Commission on Teacher Education and Certification from 11 to 13 members. (gov sig)
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 128 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS
Establishes the principal of the year awards by law and allows both the outstanding state teachers and principals to receive certain monetary awards from private sources without violating the ethics code. (gov sig)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 131 HAINKEL RETIREMENT SYSTEMS
Provides annual cost-of-living adjustment for judges and widows of such judges who did not opt to become members of the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 37, nays 58. Failed to pass.

SB 138 DARDENNE INSURERS
Requires health insurance policies to provide coverage for services rendered by registered nurse first assistants.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 140 ELLINGTON ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
Provides tracking procedures for kegs of malt beverages consumed off premises.
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 144 C ROMERO MOTOR VEHICLES
Creates the Junior Golf special prestige license plate.
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 172 MARIONNEAUX ROADS/HIGHWAYS

Designates the portion of LA 75 within the city of St. Gabriel as the "Martin Luther King , Jr. Parkway."

- SB 174 HAINKEL ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY
Modifies emergency response standards for permits for certain solid waste disposal facilities. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 191 BOISSIERE TEACHERS RETIREMENT
Provides with respect to the Initial Lump-Sum Benefit. (7/1/03)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 192 BOISSIERE PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET
Provides for and creates an excess benefit plan for members of Parochial Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana. (gov sig)
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 193 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Removes the responsibility for Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System to verify state assistance of handicapped survivors. (gov sig)

- SB 195 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET

Provides for the payment of employee and employer contributions. (gov sig)

Provides that the chairman of the Senate Retirement Committee shall receive per diem for attendance at board meetings. (gov sig)

Provides with respect to rollover provisions. (7/1/03)

- SB 256 DARDENNE ETHICS
Requires the Board of Ethics to provide access via the Internet to certain information. (gov sig)

Provides for revisions to the LaSalle Economic Development District.
Reported with amendments. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 261 HOYT ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Provides that local and parish roads in Vermilion Parish, without exception, shall become public if certain maintenance work is performed on them.

- SB 263 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Re-creates the Department of Health and Hospitals. (6/30/03)

- SB 292 MOUNT CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
Authorizes a court to require a defendant to appear in open court for good cause shown.

- SB 294 DARDENNE DENTISTRY
Revises the practice of dentistry. (2/3-CA7s2.1)
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
