

- SB 4 MCPHERSON STATE OFFICIALS  
Prohibits a public official who qualifies for election from using public funds for a public service announcement using his likeness or voice between the close of qualifying and the promulgation of returns  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 11 DUPRE VOTERS/VOTING  
Changes poll hours, expands absentee voting period, allows qualified voters to vote absentee in person, provides for counting absentee vote of voter who dies before polls open  
House conferees appointed: LANCASTER, MONTGOMERY, BRUNEAU.
- SB 30 CAIN VOTERS/VOTING  
Changes election day poll hours, removes eligibility criteria for absentee voting, extends absentee voting in person period, and increases compensation of commissioners  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 84, nays 15. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 61 C D JONES SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Creates the Monroe and Northeast Louisiana Technology and Business Incubation Center.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 70 GAUTREAUX MOTOR VEHICLES  
Prohibits driving a motor vehicle with a television capable of receiving any pre-recorded visual presentation unless the TV is behind the driver's seat or not visible to the driver while he is operating the vehicle and provides for certain exceptions.  
Notice of Senate conferees appointed.
- SB 76 ELLINGTON SHERIFFS  
Requires that the insurance premiums of the sheriff and certain deputy sheriffs of LaSalle Parish shall be paid in full from the sheriff's general fund.  
Notice of Senate rejecting House amendments.
- SB 77 MOUNT CHILDREN  
Provides relative to proximity of licensed day care centers to certain alcohol service providers and places day care centers in drug free zones.  
Notice of Senate rejecting House amendments.
- SB 86 HINES HEALTH CARE  
Creates the Louisiana Seniors Pharmacy Assistance Program. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 89 MCPHERSON PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Provides for a small business program for information technology.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 90 MCPHERSON INTERNET  
Creates a "no junk mail" listing of residential electronic mail subscribers. (gov sig) (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 120 LENTINI PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Authorizes a parish or municipality with a population exceeding 425,000 to require a contractor to pay for additional costs incurred for inspection of a project under certain conditions. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 128 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS  
Establishes the principal of the year awards by law and allows both the outstanding state teachers and principals to receive certain monetary awards from private sources without violating the ethics code. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 92, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 133 HOYT PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
 Makes inapplicable any preference for certain expanded clay aggregate products produced in the state (gov sig)  
 Notice of Senate rejecting House amendments.

SB 147 M SMITH FORESTRY  
 Provides an exception for treated wood poles and piling from preferences for products produced or manufactured in the state. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 151 CAIN COURTS  
 Provides for justices of the peace courts and their constables to be indemnified by the state. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 177 HEITMEIER BANKS/BANKING  
 Constitutional amendment to authorize public funds to be loaned or pledged by a state infrastructure bank to fund eligible infrastructure projects.  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, was finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 207 BOISSIERE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
 Increases the penalties for attempted crimes punishable by death or imprisonment at hard labor for not less than 10 nor more than 50 years without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence when attempted on a peace officer performing his duty.  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 213 DARDENNE FUNDS/FUNDING  
 Constitutional amendment to create the Louisiana Coastal Restoration Fund. (1/1/04) (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 1. The bill, having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, was finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 217 MARIONNEAUX JUDGES  
 Constitutional amendment to provide that a judge shall not remain in office beyond his seventy-sixth birthday.  
 Reported with amendments. (6,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 235 DUPRE TEACHERS  
 Increases the maximum duration a local school board is required to grant leave without pay to the president of large statewide professional organizations from two years to six consecutive years.  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 257 DARDENNE MALPRACTICE  
 Includes extracorporeal therapist as a "health care provider" and defines "extracorporeal therapist" for purposes of the Medical Malpractice Act.  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 260 ELLINGTON SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
 Provides for revisions to the LaSalle Economic Development District.  
 Notice of Senate conferees appointed.

SB 262 MOUNT MUNICIPALITIES  
 Authorizes the city of Westlake to transfer certain property.  
 Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 281 BOISSIERE STATE POLICE RET FUND  
 Provides with respect to a retirement benefit longevity increase for certain members who participated in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan on or before June 30, 2003. (07/01/03)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 303 MOUNT CHILDREN  
 Provides for the creation of multidisciplinary investigative teams for the investigation and disposition of cases of child abuse and neglect in each judicial district of the state and for the creation of child advocacy centers.  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

- SB 304 DARDENNE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE  
Provides relative to the domestic violence.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 307 SCHEDLER HEALTH SERVICES  
Provides for specific exception to ambulance licensing provisions for transport from a heliport on a hospital campus.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 323 LENTINI ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Requires construction involving lane closures on controlled access interstate highways during off-peak hours.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 326 BAJOIE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Authorizes the payment of a scholarship to child care workers who receive certification from a child care educational training program which is approved by the bureau of licensing within the Department of Social Services.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 338 CRAVINS MUNICIPALITIES  
Abolishes the legislative charter of the town of Grand Coteau and provides that the town shall be subject to the Lawrason Act. (7/1/03)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 340 IRONS TAX/TAXATION  
Requires political subdivisions to provide the vehicle commissioner with information concerning their boundaries for purposes of vehicle sales tax collection.  
Notice of Senate conferees appointed.
- SB 349 HOLDEN FUNDS/FUNDING  
Exempts the Louisiana Community and Technical College System from the requirement of depositing all funds into the state treasury.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 357 MCPHERSON MENTAL HEALTH  
Dedicates the proceeds from the sale of facilities owned by the office of mental health to the renovation of mental health facilities in the same parish as the facility that has been sold.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 358 MCPHERSON HOSPITALS  
Grants eligiblity for facility need review process for a fifty-bed addition at certain facilities with not less than one hundred fifty beds and not more than one hundred seventy-five beds.  
Rules suspended, called out of its regular order.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 359 THEUNISSEN PROCUREMENT CODE  
Exempts the Louisiana Community and Technical College System from the requirement to conduct procurement through the central purchasing agency.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 388 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Prevents the Department of Health and Hospitals from limiting the availability of prescription drugs to treat HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and atypical antipsychotic drugs to Medicaid recipients.  
House conferees appointed: WELCH, DURAND, ALARIO.
- SB 400 FONTENOT PLUMBERS  
Provides a licensed journeyman plumber to supervise apprentices on the job.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 421 MCPHERSON CONTRACTORS  
Clarifies that property owners are exempt from obtaining a contractor's license from the Louisiana State Licensing Board for Contractors for certain construction or improvements to their property.

Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,  
yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the  
Senate.

- SB 422 MCPHERSON PUBLIC WORKS  
Prohibits the state or a state or local entity from utilizing  
the "design-build" concept when awarding public works contracts  
unless authorized by law. (gov sig)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 437 CAIN HORSE RACING  
Changes the membership of the Louisiana State Racing Commission  
to delete the two at-large members and to include one person  
from each municipality or parish in which a race track is  
located.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 63, nays 32. Finally passed, ordered  
to the Senate.
- SB 476 BAJOIE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Creates the crime of theft of a used building component. (gov  
sig)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 97, nays 5. Finally passed, ordered  
to the Senate.
- SB 481 CHAISSON VIDEO POKER  
Provides for a change in the currency accepted in video draw  
poker devices.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 502 DARDENNE CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Revises the circumstances regarding the victim's incapacity as  
an element of the crime of simple rape.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 504 DARDENNE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Creates the Louisiana Coastal Restoration Fund. (1/1/04)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 505 DARDENNE SUNSET LAW  
Re-creates the Department of the Treasury and its agencies.  
(6/30/03)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 511 C D JONES CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE  
Revises statute providing for penalties for possession of GHB  
(gamma hydroxybutyric acid) or its analogues, to eliminate  
inaccurate reference to Schedule II (D)(2) and provides relative  
to the definition of a controlled substance analogue.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 552 C D JONES JUVENILE JUSTICE  
Provides for sentencing of juveniles based on race to be  
illegal.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 556 MCPHERSON PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Requires legislative approval of certain cooperative endeavor  
agreements.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 578 FONTENOT FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides that the legislature may by majority vote of the House  
and Senate return and recommend an amended Minimum Foundation  
Program formula to BESE.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 96, nays 4. Finally passed, ordered  
to the Senate.
- SB 593 SCHEDLER PUBLIC RECORDS  
Provides for certain records of the Louisiana Bureau of  
Criminal Identification and Information to be exempt from the  
Public Records Law.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 594 MCPHERSON WATER/SEWER OPERATORS  
Prohibits disposal of residential sewage or treated wastewater  
offsite without issuance of a permit issued by DEQ.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.

- SB 602 BOISSIERE SCHOOL EMPLOYEES RET  
Authorizes purchase of out-of-state service credit for  
employment by school board as "employees."

- SB 636 HEITMEIER STATE EMPLOYEE RET  
Provides for receipt of credit for military service for any  
legislator serving on January 1, 1997, who is a military  
retiree.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 660 HEITMEIER LAW ENFORCEMENT  
Authorizes active reserve or auxiliary law enforcement officers  
to carry weapons under certain conditions.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 673 ULLO WILDLIFE/FISHERIES DEPT  
Extends the Fisherman's Gear Compensation Fund for three more  
years. (07/01/03)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,  
yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the  
Senate.
- SB 683 ULLO LOCAL OFFICIALS  
Repeals provision for extra compensation for coroners and  
provides for effective dates.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 687 ULLO ELECTED OFFICIALS  
Repeals provision requiring random drug testing of elected  
officials.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 67, nays 24. Finally passed, title adopted.

- SB 727 MCPHERSON FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides that revenues generated by private entities from the

Adds a judicial administrator and his deputies as eligible  
judges and officers in Louisiana State Employees' Retirement

- SB 736 C D JONES FUNDS/FUNDING  
Creates the Rural Town Revitalization Act. (gov sig)  
Indefinitely postponed by vote of yeas 89, nays 4.
- SB 749 HAINKEL FUNDS/FUNDING  
Establishes the Louisiana Arts and Entertainment Industry  
Development Fund.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 761 CAIN SEX OFFENSES  
Provides relative to the definition of aggravated rape and to  
the conditions of bail relative to such offense.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,  
yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the  
Senate.
- SB 792 BARHAM ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT  
Authorizes the classification of security sensitive information  
and personal identification information as defined in  
regulations as confidential. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 104, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered  
to the Senate.
- SB 797 BAJOIE CHILDREN  
Requires instructions on laws of mandatory reporting of child  
abuse prior to receiving teacher certification.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 801 MARIONNEAUX EMPLOYMENT  
Allows certain employers to obtain criminal records of job  
applicant.

Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 867 SCHEDLER LSU SYSTEM  
Revises the structure of the LSU Health Sciences Center-Health Care Service Division.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 87, nays 15. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 868 JOHNSON SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides relative to the Lake Forest Estates Improvement District. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 869 JOHNSON HEALTH CARE  
Prohibits smoking in all areas of the Louisiana Superdome.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 870 JOHNSON SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides relative to the Huntington Park Subdivision Improvement District. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 882 MALONE ELECTION CODE  
Authorizes certain elected officials to contest the candidacy of a person in a primary election.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 3. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 890 HAINKEL CONFIRMATION  
Removes the required Senate reconfirmation for certain boards and commissions.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 900 BOISSIERE LOCAL EMPLOYEES  
Authorizes certain persons to forward warrants to the director of the Department of Public Safety.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 908 HAINKEL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS  
Provides relative to Model Health Emergency Powers Act.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered

to the Senate.

- SB 909 CAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS  
Requires the La. Public Service Commission to promulgate certain rules and regulations.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 917 MALONE MOTOR CARRIERS  
Exempts motor carriers of salt water from proving public convenience and necessity.  
Notice of change of Senate conferees.
- SB 931 ELLINGTON FAMILY LAW  
Provides for the preemptive period in which to annul an adoption. (7/1/03)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 942 THOMAS PUBLIC LANDS  
Authorizes the secretaries for DHH and DSS and the commissioner of administration to convey, transfer, lease, or execute cooperative agreements with respect to certain properties in the state. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 947 M SMITH FAMILY LAW  
Limits the liability for a pastoral counselor operating under the requirements of a covenant marriage.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 963 CRAVINS CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES  
Provides for the closure of Swanson Correctional Center for Youth-Madison Parish Unit at Tallulah, Louisiana.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call. Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 969 BOISSIERE CIVIL PROCEDURE  
Repeals Section 3 of Act 734 of the 1999 Regular Session. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 972 BOISSIERE PARISHES  
Provides for the maximum penalties that can be imposed by ordinance in certain parishes for dumping trash and other substances. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 975 DARDENNE FAMILY LAW  
Provides relative to relocation of a child.  
Notice given subject to call.
- SB 983 DARDENNE SEX OFFENSES  
Provides for termination of the parental rights of a parent convicted of sexually abusing their children.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 986 IRONS LOCAL RETIREMENT  
Authorizes eligible members to elect to participate in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan on a retroactive basis and receive a lump sum benefit of up to five years based upon the value of the pension at the retroactive date selected.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 1005 HEITMEIER PLANNING/ZONING  
Authorizes regional planning commissions in urbanized areas with populations in excess of one million to include transportation design and engineering services in the duties of the commission. (7/1/03)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 1008 MCPHERSON LOCAL EMPLOYEES  
Provides relative to the Rapides Parish Civil Service System and Personnel Administration.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1010 CHAISSON SCHOOLS  
Eliminates exception in St. Charles Parish to the general rule that a member of any local school board may qualify and run for another public office without his school board seat being vacated. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1024 C ROMERO FUNDS/FUNDING  
Creates the enforcement emergency situation response account for the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries in the Conservation Fund.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 1027 JOHNSON CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Prohibits cross burning with an intent to intimidate.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 91, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1028 LENTINI LAW ENFORCEMENT  
Expands eligibility for payment of supplemental pay to certain elected chiefs of police.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 1031 C ROMERO LAW ENFORCEMENT  
Requires the investigation of an alleged violation of the crime of identify theft when requested by the victim and requires training of peace officers relative to such crime if funds are made available.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1032 MARIONNEAUX ETHICS  
Provides exceptions for public officials and their immediate family who make application for subdividing or zoning of property or building permits and inspections in certain parishes.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 42, nays 50. Failed to pass.

SB 1033 B JONES MUSEUMS  
Establishes the Louisiana Military Museum and the Jean Lafitte Marine Fisheries Museum within the Department of State.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 1035 DUPRE MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEE RET  
Allows employees of planning and development commissions to join the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana. (7/1/03)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1056 HOYT ECONOMIC DEVELOP DEPT  
Adds two members to the Vermilion Parish Economic Development District board of commissioners to be appointed by the Vermilion Parish Tourist Commission and the Abbeville Harbor and Terminal District.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 1064 MARIONNEAUX COURTS  
Authorizes the City Court of Plaquemine to assess a fee for substance abuse treatment and increases court costs for each violation.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1076 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS  
Requires asset management companies providing services to public retirement systems to have a physical place of business within this state and authorizes investments in small emerging, investment, and venture capital businesses. (7/1/03)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 94, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 1080 ELLINGTON ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL  
Provides for disbursement and incentives for funds from the waste tire fund.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered

to the Senate.

- SB 1090      BAJOIE                      LOCAL AGENCIES  
Creates a human services authority in certain parishes. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 1094      THOMAS                      ETHICS  
Revises nepotism law to allow the employment of an electrician whose immediate family member is a school board member for that parish. (1/1/04)
