

- SB 21 CAIN FUNDS/FUNDING
Revises dedications of money in the Vernon Parish Community Improvement Fund. (7/1/03)
Reported with amendments. Rules suspended, read by title, committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 40 SCHEDLER JUVENILES
Rescinds confidentiality provisions regarding juvenile crime victims for the purposes of child abduction alert systems, such as the AMBER Alert network.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 135 GAUTREAUX TAX/TAXATION
Includes as bona fide agricultural land subject to use value, rather than fair market value, property tax assessment the use of agricultural lands by an owner-occupier of a tract of at least 8 acres if at least 3 acres are used as a family farm.(gs)
Read by title and finally passed as amended 28 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 193 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Removes the responsibility for Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System to verify state assistance of handicapped survivors. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 195 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Removes the sunset date of July 1, 2003, for partial repayments of refunds. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 196 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Provides for the payment of employee and employer contributions. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. Rules suspended, read by title, committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 197 BOISSIERE CLERKS OF COURT RET
Deletes reference to the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee from provisions of law relating to per diem. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 198 BOISSIERE STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Provides that the chairman of the Senate Retirement Committee shall receive per diem for attendance at board meetings. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 199 BOISSIERE CLERKS OF COURT RET
Provides that the chairman of the Senate Retirement Committee serve as an ex-officio member of the board. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 214 DUPRE FUNDS/FUNDING
Const. amend. authorizing certain uses for nonrecurring revenue, authorizing certain deposits into Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fd, and eliminating the cap on mineral revenues that can be part of the balance in the fund. (2/3-CA13s1(A))
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 279 DARDENNE TAX/TAXATION
Requires approvals for the use of state sales tax increments for financing local government subdivisions. (gov sig)
Read by title and finally passed, 29 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 285 LENTINI ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
Authorizes retail distribution center permits for commercial airlines and prohibits local permits or fees.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 29 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House.

- SB 293 DARDENNE TAX EXEMPTIONS
Provides for Direct Payment Numbers for private, non-profit, tax-exempt organizations.

- SB 300 CHAISSON LOCAL OFFICIALS
Provides for the appointment of public administrators for successions in certain parishes.
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 306 SCHEDLER HEALTH SERVICES
Revises provisions for disciplinary proceedings involving emergency medical personnel.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 312 BOISSIERE STATE POLICE RET FUND
Provides retroactive eligibility for survivor benefits in limited circumstances where surviving spouse was married to decedent for less than two years prior to death. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 332 CRAVINS INTERGOVERN RELATIONS
Adopts a revised Interstate Compact for Juveniles. (7/1/04)
Read by title and finally passed as amended 29 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 340 IRONS TAX/TAXATION
Requires political subdivisions to provide the vehicle commissioner with information concerning their boundaries for purposes of vehicle sales tax collection.
Reported with amendments. Rules suspended, read by title, committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 399 FONTENOT STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Provides for eligibility for cost-of-living increases. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. Rules suspended, read by title, committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 414 M SMITH COURTS
Authorizes certain villages to appoint a court magistrate.
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 423 MCPHERSON CIVIL PROCEDURE
Authorizes federal court judges to perform marriage ceremonies within the state. (gov sig)
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 426 BOISSIERE PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET
Provides for the calculation of benefits for members of the Parochial Employees' Retirement System of Louisiana. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 450 CRAVINS STATE EMPLOYEE RET
Provides for retirement of judges and court officers with ten years of creditable service after attaining age sixty. (gov sig)
Reported favorably, rules suspended, read by title, ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 457 DUPRE CIVIL PROCEDURE
Authorizes justice of the peace court to have jurisdiction over the removal, disposition or abandonment of certain objects.
Read by title and finally passed, 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 505 DARDENNE SUNSET LAW
Re-creates the Department of the Treasury and its agencies. (6/30/03)
Read by title and finally passed, 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 513 C D JONES CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

Provides that unsecured personal surety may be posted by any qualified state resident.

Read by title and finally passed, 27 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- SB 552 C D JONES JUVENILE JUSTICE
Provides for sentencing of juveniles based on race to be illegal.
Read by title and finally passed, 30 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 565 IRONS MARRIAGE
Provides exceptions from the seventy-two hour delay for certain marriage ceremonies in Orleans Parish.
Read by title and failed to pass, 18 yeas and 11 nays.

- SB 568 DUPRE FUNDS/FUNDING
Authorizes certain uses for nonrecurring revenues, authorizes certain deposits into the Wetlands Conservation and Restoration Fund, and eliminates the cap on mineral revenues that can be part of the balance in that fund. (7/1/04)
