- SB 45 MCPHERSON FISH/FISHING  
Authorizes the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to establish a program for removal of abandoned crab traps.

- SB 62 MCPHERSON CIVIL PROCEDURE  
Provides that the mother is the proper party to enforce certain rights or an obligations of an unemancipated minor under certain circumstances.

Provides a limitation of liability to certain persons providing

SB 315 SCHEDLER FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS  
Creates the Perfusion Licensure Act to provide for the  
licensing of medical technicians to practice perfusion.

SB 323 LENTINI ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Requires construction involving lane closures on controlled  
access interstate highways during off-peak hours.  
Read by title and finally passed, 27 years and 1 nays. Title  
read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to  
reconsider tabled.

SB 326 BAJOIE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Authorizes the payment of a scholarship to child care workers  
who receive certification from a child care educational training  
program which is approved by the bureau of licensing within the  
Department of Social Services.

Rules suspended; reported with amendments.

- SB 349 HOLDEN FUNDS/FUNDING  
Exempts the Louisiana Community and Technical College System from the requirement of depositing all funds into the state treasury.  
Read by title and finally passed as amended 31 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 357 MCPHERSON MENTAL HEALTH  
Dedicates the proceeds from the sale of facilities owned by the office of mental health to the renovation of mental health facilities in the same parish as the facility that has been sold.

- SB 372 SCHEDLER PUBLIC SFTY/CORRECT DEPT  
Authorizes a fee for fingerprinting conducted by the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information related to non-criminal purposes. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))  
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted. Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 385 SCHEDLER VITAL STATISTICS  
Changes the fee to be charged for death certificates and changes requirements for burial transit permits.  
Read by title and finally passed as amended 30 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 388 SCHEDLER HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Prevents the Department of Health and Hospitals from limiting the availability of prescription drugs to treat HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and atypical antipsychotic drugs to Medicaid recipients.

- SB 707 M SMITH FARMING  
Changes the number of times the Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority meets. (gov sig)

Revises nepotism law to allow the employment of an electrician whose immediate family member is a school board member for that parish. (1/1/04)

- SB 1097 DARDENNE TEACHERS RETIREMENT  
Provides that the director and staff of the Louisiana Resource Center for Educators are teachers for the purposes of membership, relative to the Teachers Retirement System of Louisiana. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 1098 DARDENNE COURTS  
Authorizes the Nineteenth Judicial District Court to designate matters to be heard by specific divisions of the court.

- SB 1105 THOMAS COURTS  
Provides for the territorial jurisdiction of the justice of the peace courts in Tangipahoa Parish.

- SB 1121 DUPRE TAX/AD VALOREM  
Deletes certain requirements that protested taxes be used only for nonrecurring purposes, requires notice of amount in dispute, creates a rule to compel a taxpayer to state and pay tax he deems correct, and extends a July 1, 2003 termination date. (gs)

- SB 1126 LENTINI ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT  
Changes the health insurance requirements for employees whose wages are equal to or greater than \$50,000 in order to qualify under the "Louisiana Quality Jobs Program Act". (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
