- SB 116 DARDENNE AGED PERSONS
Requires DSS to promulgate rules to require adult residential care homes to provide for residents during times of emergency and natural disasters.

Read by title and finally passed as amended 32 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House.

- SB 150 DUPRE CONTRACTS
Provides that contingent fee agreement between an insured and a public adjuster is against public policy and is null and void.

- SB 400 FONTENOT PLUMBERS
Provides a licensed journeyman plumber to supervise apprentices on the job.
