Requires the free enterprise curriculum to include instruction in personal finance beginning with the 2004-2005 school year. (gov sig)  
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 50 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS  
Eliminates caps on teacher and support person of the year awards and provides for school board approval.  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 55 C FIELDS AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE  
Prohibits insurers from canceling an automobile insurance policy under certain circumstances.  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 83 THEUNISSEN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT  
Re-creates the Department of Education and its agencies. (6/30/03)  
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 86 HINES HEALTH CARE  
Creates the Louisiana Seniors Pharmacy Assistance Program. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 34 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 112 THEUNISSEN EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY  
Allows distinguished educators to extend their employment up to 6 years at certain low performing schools. (gov sig)  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 116 DARDENNE AGED PERSONS  
Requires DSS to promulgate rules to require adult residential care homes to provide for residents during times of emergency and natural disasters.  
Sent to the Governor for Executive approval.
- SB 126 THEUNISSEN TEACHERS  
Increases membership on the State Advisory Commission on Teacher Education and Certification from 11 to 13 members. (gov sig)  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 181 CAIN POSTSECONDARY ED  
Constitutional amendment to provide for the Senate and the House of Representatives to each elect four members to the Board of Regents and each management board and for the governor to appoint the balance of the membership. (2/3-CA13s1(A)) (1/12/04)  
Called from the calendar.  
Read by title as amended, and failed to pass 8 yeas, and 24 nays. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 213 DARDENNE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Constitutional amendment to create the Louisiana Coastal Restoration Fund. (1/1/04) (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Called from the calendar.

- SB 281 BOISSIERE STATE POLICE RET FUND  
Provides with respect to a retirement benefit longevity increase for certain members who participated in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan on or before June 30, 2003. (07/01/03)  
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 294 DARDENNE DENTISTRY  
Revises the practice of dentistry. (2/3-CA7s2.1)  
Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB 307 SCHEDLER HEALTH SERVICES  
Provides for specific exception to ambulance licensing provisions for transport from a heliport on a hospital campus.  
Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Rules suspended. Called from the calendar.  
Read by title and finally passed, 36 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 329 HAINKEL STATE EMPLOYEE RET  
Authorizes a member who was employed by justice department to

convert certain unused accrued leave to service credit. (gov sig)

Read by title and finally passed, 32 yeas and 1 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- SB 330 BOISSIERE SHERIFFS PEN/RELIEF FUND  
Provides for purchase of Vietnam Conflict military service credit, relative to the Sheriffs' Pension and Relief Fund. (7/1/03)

- SB 419 MCPHERSON CONTRACTS  
Prohibits the automatic renewal of a contract.

Provides for self-directed investment funds in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan. (1/1/04)

- SB 942 THOMAS PUBLIC LANDS  
To authorize the secretary for the Department of Health and  
Hospitals and the commissioner of administration, to enter into  
an agreement with respect to the exchange of certain properties  
in Washington Parish. (gov sig)

SB 1036 C D JONES SCHOOLS  
Creates and provides for Priority Education Zone comprised of the poorest school systems with the lowest achievement and resource providers and directs extra money and resources to such systems. (gov sig)  
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 1042 IRONS SCHOOLS  
Provides for the addition of two appointed members to the Orleans Parish School Board. (gov sig)

SB 1076 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS  
Requires asset management companies providing services to public retirement systems to have a physical place of business within this state and authorizes investments in small emerging, investment, and venture capital businesses. (7/1/03)

SB 1087 CRAVINS LOCAL OFFICIALS

SB 1113 ELLINGTON MOTOR VEHICLES

SB 1127 LENTINI TAX/TAXATION  
Authorizes certain persons to use direct pay numbers to pay taxes. (1/1/04)

Memorializes Congress to provide an exception to the Sherman Anti-Trust Act to allow U.S. based and owned small and medium size lumber manufacturers to sell their products directly to the consumer.
