- SB 62 C FIELDS PROBATION/PAROLE  
Requires medical probation to be granted by home incarceration; authorizes medical probation for inmates who have served 20 yrs. of a life sentence and for those sentenced for 1st or 2nd degree murder if they are terminally ill, if no cost to the state.

Provides for a change in terminology for illegitimate children.

SB 372 THEUNISSEN CONSUMERS

SB 771 CRAVINS CONTRACTORS

SB 806 DUPRE TAX EXEMPTIONS  
Constitutional amendment to provide for the homestead exemption to certain people, certain land, to property occupied by a surviving spouse, by certain trusts, where usufruct has been granted for a lifetime and under bond for deed contracts.
