Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 65 C FIELDS CHILDREN  
Provides for a change in terminology for illegitimate children.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 67 MCPHERSON EXPROPRIATION  
Authorizes the city of Pineville to expropriate by a declaration of taking for the Susek Drive Project. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 112 HOLLIS CIVIL PROCEDURE  
Clarifies that ROTH IRA's are exempt from seizure by creditors.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 119 MCPHERSON NURSING HOMES  
Authorizes the Louisiana Board of Examiners of Nursing Facility Administrators to incur debt in the purchase of an office building. (gov sig)

Provides for updated definitions regarding controlled substances.
