

- SB 2 MCPHERSON HUNTERS/HUNTING
Constitutional amendment to preserve the freedom to hunt, fish, and trap subject to regulation, restriction, or prohibition imposed by law. (2/3-CA13s1(A))
Reported without amendments. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 4 MCPHERSON PUBLIC WORKS
Provides relative to certain public contracts (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 17 B GAUTREAUX ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates La. Highway 1013 in Assumption Parish as "Reedy Road".
Reported favorably. (10,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 18 MCPHERSON ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates a portion of La. Highway 28 East in central Louisiana as Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 21 DUPRE PRIVILEGES/LIENS
Provides relative to the cancellation of certain mortgage inscriptions on residential property.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 28 DUPRE TRANSPORTATION/DEV DEPT
Adds safe evacuation of population as factor to be considered in priority reports on current construction projects. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 30 DUPRE FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Increases time requires for possession of a learner's permit prior to obtaining an intermediate license from 90 to 180 days if the holder is under 17 years of age.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 35 N GAUTREAUX HUNTERS/HUNTING
Allows the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to offer instruction for safely riding "four wheeler" or all-terrain vehicles in the firearm and hunter education program.
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 45 M SMITH WILD REFUGES/PRESERVES
Authorizes the Saline Lake Game and Fish Preserve Commission and the Grant Parish Police Jury, under the supervision of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, to place triploid grass carp in certain lakes at their own expense.
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 52 ULLO IMMOVABLE PROPERTY
Requires additional information in residential property disclosures which informs a potential purchaser of the existence of a homeowners' association affecting the property.
Reported favorably. (6,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 94 LENTINI CIVIL PROCEDURE
Requires an affidavit to certify when a suit against the state will result in a deficit of state funds and authorizes such affidavit to be traversed.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 97 ADLEY RADIO/TV
Repeals licensing requirement for citizens band radio technicians.

- SB 102 CHAISSON COURTS
Provides that the Supreme Court of Louisiana may expend any fee fund balance to defray the expense of employment benefits.

- SB 117 MCPHERSON FUNDS/FUNDING
Requires \$2 of any penalty or fine to be paid into the Fish and Wildlife Violations Reward Fund to pay rewards to individuals who provide information on criminal activity involving fish and wildlife.

- SB 120 MCPHERSON WATER/WATERWAYS
Includes certain waters within state natural and scenic rivers system. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 138 SCHEDLER PARISHES
Provides for additional administrative adjudication procedures in St. Tammany Parish. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (11,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 145 ELLINGTON LIABILITY
Increases weight limitation on motorized off-road vehicles relative to limitation of liability during off-road vehicle activities.
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 146 ELLINGTON MATRIMONIAL REGIMES
Provides relative to the valuation of goodwill as an asset of community property.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 152 MARIONNEAUX FARMING
Provides for issuance of special weight permits to operators of vehicles hauling sugarcane, agronomic, or horticultural crops. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 164 N GAUTREAUX JUVENILES
Provides additional locations where it is unlawful for sexually violent predators and sexual offenders to be present.
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 186 MCPHERSON PRIVILEGES/LIENS
Provides privilege for the recovery of cost on repaired marine vessels, trailers, and equipment.
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 190 LENTINI JUDGES
Provides authority for certain federal judges to preside over a marriage ceremony until December, 2004. (gov sig)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 196 M SMITH WEIGHTS/MEASURES
Provides that there is no violation of the vehicle weight laws unless the weight of a tandem axle on a vehicle transporting farm and forest products in their natural state under a special harvest season permit is 3,000 pounds over the limit. (gov sig)

- SB 199 M SMITH U S PROPERTY
Removes sunset provision relative to authorization of agreements ceding concurrent jurisdiction to the United States over certain lands acquired, leased, occupied, or controlled by or for the U.S. Department of Justice for operation of correction.
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 226 DARDENNE NOTARIES
Provides relative to the form of the names required on notarial acts.
Reported favorably. (8,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 227 DARDENNE COMMERCIAL REGULATIONS
Provides for security on movable property.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 267 ULLO ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Renames the Lafitte Larose Boulevard to the Leo Kerner/Lafitte Parkway in Jefferson Parish.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 269 CAIN ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Re-designates a portion of U.S. 90 in Calcasieu Parish as the "Veterans Memorial Highway 90".
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 282 DARDENNE CIVIL PROCEDURE
Provides relative to payment of fees for certain service of citation within ninety days of commencement of an action. Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 289 BOISSIERE PUBLIC WORKS
Provides for notification by governmental entities of addendums to a bid over the contract limit. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. (10,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 302 HINES MALPRACTICE
Provides that medical review panel reports and requests are non-reportable. Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 339 HAINKEL USUFRUCT
Provides relative to the form of security on property subject to a usufruct and provides relative to security required by a testamentary usufruct. Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 346 CHAISSON PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS
Provides for the South Louisiana Port Commission. Reported favorably. (10,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 347 M SMITH ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Authorizes DOTD to sell timber on highway rights-of-way and provides for dedication of such proceeds to the Transportation Trust Fund for repair of roads not eligible for federal matching funds. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 359 HINES MALPRACTICE
Provides relative to claims filed under the Medical Malpractice Act. Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 364 C ROMERO DISTRICT ATTORNEYS
Provides for funding of the 16th JDC district attorney. Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 368 DUPRE LEVEES
Provides for the powers, duties, functions, and membership of the Lafourche Basin Levee District. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 370 LENTINI MALPRACTICE
Authorizes the attorney for the plaintiff to appoint the attorney member of the state medical review panel under certain circumstances. Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 371 LENTINI MALPRACTICE
Provides for future medical care and related benefits in medical malpractice claims. Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 381 LENTINI MALPRACTICE
Adds students being trained as paramedics to definition of ambulance service for purposes of the Patient's Compensation Fund. Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 382 LENTINI MALPRACTICE
Provides for only one panel for the review of state and private medical claims in certain circumstances. (gov sig)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 392 MCPHERSON HEALTH CARE
Provides for inclusion of adult residential centers in the facility need review process. Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 394 BARHAM TAX/TAXATION
Exempts diesel fuel from local sales tax or excise tax. (gov sig)

Reported with amendments. (15,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

- SB 401 MARIONNEAUX GAMING
Eliminates the 180-day time limit on allowing continued operation of video poker devices for persons who are already licensed at the time of application.
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 408 BAJOIE HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Creates the Women's Health Commission within the Department of Health and Hospitals.
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 432 C D JONES WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Changes the amount of attorney fees on workers' compensation awards to twenty percent of the recovered amount. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 433 THEUNISSEN WILDLIFE RESOURCES
Creates the Louisiana Aquatic Invasive Species Council and Task Force. (gov sig)
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 434 THEUNISSEN AIRCRAFT/AVIATION
Authorizes the use of certain monies for the General Aviation and Reliever Airport Maintenance Grant Program and provides limitations. (7/1/05)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 437 L JACKSON OBLIGATIONS
Provides relative to the initiation of prescription on child support judgments. (gov sig)
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 460 DUPRE TAX EXEMPTIONS
Requires any taxpayer entitled to the homestead exemption to own and occupy the homestead on or before November 15 of the calendar year in which the exemption is claimed except in Orleans. (gov sig)
Reported favorably. (13,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 472 DARDENNE PILOTS
Creates the Louisiana River Pilot Fee Commission and the Board of Louisiana River Pilot Review and Oversight. (gov sig)
Read by title, under the rules, referred to the Committee on COMMERCE.
- SB 487 HEITMEIER FEES/LICENSES/PERMITS
Waives the collection of any charges for a duplicate driver's license if the license has been stolen.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 488 HEITMEIER WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Defines "owner operator" as regards motor carriers. (gov sig)
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 496 SCHEDLER ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Designates a portion of Interstate 10 as the Stephen E. Ambrose Memorial Parkway.
Reported favorably. (10,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 513 ELLINGTON TAX/AD VALOREM
Extends until 7/1/2006, a termination date for various property tax payment under protest procedures and authorizes the use of taxes paid under protest for certain nonrecurring expenses in the case of public service property taxpayers. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. (12,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 550 IRONS ANIMALS
Provides relative to the Louisiana Animal Welfare Commission.
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 555 DUPRE SAFETY REGULATIONS
Provides for medical exemptions to the window tint requirements on motor vehicles. (1/1/05)
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

- SB 559 ELLINGTON MARKETING/PROMOTION
Creates the Louisiana Aquaculture Coordinating Council. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 564 DARDENNE CHILDREN
Provides relative to federal and state tax deduction, extraordinary medical expenses, and mortgage and rental payments as they apply to child custody obligations.
Reported with amendments. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 579 C D JONES PUBLIC RECORDS
Provides that certain records pertaining to negotiations relative to economic development activities shall not be public records until negotiations are concluded.
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 581 SCHEDLER CIVIL PROCEDURE
Requires a tenant who refuses to comply with an eviction notice to pay resulting court costs.
Reported favorably. (9,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 596 NEVERS SPECIAL DISTRICTS
Authorizes an increase in the maximum per diem of members of the boards of commissioners of certain consolidated gravity drainage districts. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 657 BOISSIERE COURTS
Requires the appropriation of the costs of mandated positions and the costs of jury commissions and sanity hearings in the criminal district court and requires the appropriation be allocated to such court. (gov sig)
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 672 HOLDEN WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Provides that immunity from civil liability under workers' compensation shall not extend to situations where an employer removes adequate safeguards. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments. (6,2) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 692 BARHAM EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS
Requires employers of first responders to homeland security emergencies to maintain the employment, pay rate levels, pensions, and benefits for those first responders. (gov sig)
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 695 MALONE PRESCRIPTION
Provides relative to mineral rights in land acquired or expropriated by governmental entity. (9/1/04)
Reported with amendments. (8,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 711 MCPHERSON NURSING HOMES
Provides that Medicaid certified nursing home beds be dually certified for Medicare.
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 735 MCPHERSON HEALTH CARE
Exempts penal and correctional facilities from the requirements of licensure as end stage renal disease (ESRD) facilities. (gov sig)

Authorizes the transfer of certain state property in Assumption Parish from DOTD to the Assumption Parish Police Jury. (gov sig)
