

- SB 11 THEUNISSEN LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS  
Establishes the Louisiana Commission on Civic Education. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 105 DUPRE WILDLIFE/FISHERIES DEPT  
Provides that Wildlife and Fisheries Commission shall elect its chairman and vice-chairman at first meeting in January.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 133 C FIELDS SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Creates the Concord Estates Crime Prevention District.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 140 BAJOIE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Requires criminal background checks on those working with the infirm in certain agencies and bars employment in such agencies of persons convicted of enumerated offenses. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 160 HAINKEL WATER/WATERWAYS  
Repeals provision that allows for commercial or suburban agricultural zoning classification exemption for tracts of land located along the banks of the Tchefuncte River from Louisiana Highway No. 22 to Lake Pontchartrain.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 169 IRONS CHILDREN'S CODE  
Provides relative to qualifications of counsel in child protection proceedings. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 218 C FIELDS SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Creates the South Burbank Crime Prevention and Development District. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 241 IRONS CHILDREN  
Requires certain licensed child care facilities to adopt a written safe sleep policy and to provide training.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 243 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS  
Provides for the eligibility of certain benefits for the attorney general.  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 249 BAJOIE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Provides for corrections to Louisiana's adopted subsidy laws for compliance with federal regulations. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 257 MCPHERSON CONTRACTS  
Provides relative to the automatic renewal of certain contracts.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 274 LENTINI SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Provides relative to the disposition of child abuse investigatory reports within DSS. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 290 BOISSIERE PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET  
Provides with respect to DROP and member contributions. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 308 DUPRE NATURAL RESOURCES DEPT  
Provides certain procedures and requirements relating to coastal management program guidelines, coastal use permitting, and mitigation of wetlands losses. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 345 CHAISSON GAMING  
Specifies the restaurant features for a truck stop to be qualified for video poker and limits restaurant requirements to such features.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 356 CHEEK MUNICIPALITIES  
Provides for renewal of certain additional sales and use taxes in the city of Shreveport.

Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

- SB 367 HINES HEALTH/ACC INSURANCE  
Provides for the classification of certain types of cancer as occupational diseases or infirmities connected with the duties of a firefighter.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 411 BAJOIE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPT  
Mandates licensure of child-placing agencies. (gov sig)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 445 L JACKSON FAMILY LAW  
Provides for administrative suspension of certain licenses for nonpayment of child support.  
Reported favorably. (12,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 490 CRAVINS JUVENILE JUSTICE  
Provides that a regional defense service center shall include a regional juvenile defense center.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 492 SCHEDLER NURSING HOMES  
Creates the Nursing Home Quality and Efficiency Board.  
Reported with amendments. (12,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- SB 494 SCHEDLER FISH/FISHING  
Authorize use of multi-pronged barbed gigs for harvesting flounder  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 523 BAJOIE WEAPONS  
Prohibits the illegal carrying of a firearm at a parade when the firearm is used in the commission of a crime of violence.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 535 IRONS CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Prohibits the employment of nonlicensed persons who have been convicted of certain offenses in certain care facilities.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.
- SB 539 IRONS CHILDREN  
Provides relative to the attorney compensation system in child protection cases.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 542 ULLO TEACHERS  
Requires participants in certain undergraduate teacher education programs to complete a prescribed number of semester hours as established by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.
- SB 556 DUPRE DWI  
Creates the impaired driver tracking system.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 570 CHAISSON EVIDENCE  
Provides when prior inconsistent statements are not hearsay.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 592 CHAISSON CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Provides with respect to evidence of similar crimes, wrongs, or acts in sex offense cases.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 616 CHAISSON GAMING  
Provides for the calculation of fuel to be a truck stop for gaming on a monthly basis and provides that fuel sales requirements and amenities maintenance shall be suspended for force majeure.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- SB 617 ULLO POSTSECONDARY ED  
Requires the Board of Regents to develop and maintain a state student financial aid plan.

SB 633 KOSTELKA CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Criminalizes nonpayment of child support.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 645 HINES CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE  
Provides for updated definitions regarding controlled substances.  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 709 MICHOT PUBLIC RECORDS  
Provides for the disposition of original records and evidentiary status of reproduced records, except plats, maps, and photographs and provides relative to documentation of certain records in certain courts  
Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 710 ELLINGTON BOATS/BOATING  
Prohibits persons under 16 from operating a personal watercraft, but authorizes such operation by those 13 years of age or older on 8/15/04, but less than 16, if they have completed a boating safety course.  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 732 CAIN INSURERS  
Provides for surplus lines policies and certain requirements for surplus lines insurers and brokers. (1/1/05)  
Read by title, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 756 C D JONES SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Authorizes per diem for the Madison Parish Hospital Service District Board of Commissioners. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 757 C D JONES EXPROPRIATION  
Authorizes the city of Monroe to take possession of adjudicated property. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 758 C D JONES TAX/LOCAL  
Authorizes the city of Monroe to levy and collect an additional sales and use tax. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 764 LENTINI SUITS AGAINST STATE  
Provides relative to the prohibition of injunctions against the state resulting from suits involving the expenditure of state funds when such expenditure would result in a deficit.  
Received in the House from the Senate, rules suspended, read by title.

SB 767 HAINKEL WATER/WATERWAYS  
Prohibits the use of the bottom of Lake Pontchartrain for certain purposes. (gov sig)  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 772 MALONE SCHOOLS  
Authorizes the parish school board in certain parishes to name an auditorium in honor of a former teacher and principal. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 785 C D JONES SCHOOLS  
Provides for the creation of the Northeast Louisiana Delta Learning Center.  
Read by title, recommitted to the Committee on APPROPRIATIONS.

SB 801 C ROMERO LOCAL FINANCE  
Authorizes political subdivisions, with voter approval, to renew or continue any sales tax for any purpose set forth in the proposition and provides that renewal or continuation may exceed constitutional or statutory limit on tax rates. (gov sig)  
Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments.

SB 806 DUPRE TAX EXEMPTIONS  
Constitutional amendment to provide for the homestead exemption to certain people, certain land, to property occupied by a surviving spouse, by certain trusts, where usufruct has been granted for a lifetime and under bond for deed contracts.  
Reported with amendments. (7,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

SB 821 BAJOIE HEALTH CARE  
Creates and provides for Louisiana Diabetes Initiatives Council. (7/1/04)  
Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 826 L JACKSON HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Creates an advisory board to establish a standard health form for schools.  
Reported favorably. (13,0) (Regular) Referred to the Legislative Bureau.

Authorizes the sale and transfer of certain property from DOTD and from DHH to certain entities.

SB 840 L JACKSON PUBLIC HEALTH  
Provides relation to educational materials on hepatitis C for veterans.

Expresses support for Southern University A & M College Vision 2010 project designed to create 2010 jobs by the year 2010.

HB 1163 LAFLEUR SCHOOLS/EMPLOYEES  
 Permits city, parish, or other local public or nonpublic school systems to contract with local law enforcement agencies to provide for school resource officers  
 Read by title, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

HB 1166 MORRELL TEACHERS  
 Provides that any teacher who holds a valid Type A or Type B Louisiana teaching certificate shall be determined to meet the standard of being highly qualified for all purposes of any state or federal requirement or definition relative thereto  
 Involuntarily deferred in committee.

HB 1247 BEARD STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHIP  
 Provides alternative TOPS Opportunity Award eligibility requirements for certain high school students who graduate during the 2003-2004 school year or thereafter and do not have the specified minimum ACT/SAT score  
 Involuntarily deferred in committee.

HB 1260 CAZAYOUX MOTOR VEHICLES  
 Prohibits the operation of certain motor scooters on sidewalks  
 Called from the calendar.  
 Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 83, nays 15. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.

HB 1272 M POWELL INDIGENT DEFENSE  
 Provides with respect to nominees for consideration to the judicial district indigent defender boards  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, title adopted, ordered to the Senate.

HB 1296 GLOVER DISTRICTS/SPECIAL  
 Creates and provides for a taxing district in the City of Shreveport  
 Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

HB 1317 DANIEL WILDLIFE & FISHERIES SEC  
 Authorizes the secretary to have certain materials printed to assist in the promotion of hunting and fishing  
 Sent to the Governor for executive approval.

HB 1331 PINAC COSMETOLOGY  
 Makes various changes to the Louisiana Cosmetology Act, including fees, booth permits, minimum classroom footage, and record certification  
 Called from the calendar.  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 64, nays 29. The bill, not having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, failed to pass.

HB 1401 J R SMITH PAWNBROKERS  
 Decreases the maturity date for jewelry pledged in pawnshops  
 Sent to the Governor for executive approval.

HB 1410 LAFLEUR JUDGMENTS/CIVIL  
 Requires the last four digits of the social security number of the defendant to be included in certain petitions and judgments  
 Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.

HB 1416 TOOMY GAMBLING/CHARITABLE  
 Provides for charitable license fees  
 Called from the calendar.  
 Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 60, nays 30. The bill, not having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, failed to pass.  
 Motion to reconsider tabled.

HB 1417 TOOMY GAMBLING/CHARITABLE

Provides for electronic bingo card dabber devices  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final  
passage, yeas 65, nays 28. Finally passed, title adopted,  
ordered to the Senate.
