

- SB 10 DUPRE PUBLIC LANDS  
Authorizes the Terrebonne Parish School Board to negotiate and lease certain properties to the Terrebonne Council on Aging, Inc.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 11 THEUNISSEN LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS  
Establishes the Louisiana Commission on Civic Education. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 12 THEUNISSEN ROADS/HIGHWAYS  
Extends the authorization for appropriation of state funds for the Monkey Island Ferry until July 1, 2008.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 76, nays 19. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 14 DUPRE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE  
Authorizes the release of criminal history records to the office of disciplinary counsel of the La. Attorney Disciplinary Board of the LA. State Bar Association.  
House conferees appointed: MARTINY, BALDONE, CAZAYOUX.
- SB 16 B GAUTREUX STUDENTS  
Requires local school boards to adopt, enforce, and post policies prohibiting the hazing of students in public elementary and secondary schools. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 101, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 27 MCPHERSON FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides that revenues generated by private entities from the operation, management, or control of public lands or facilities in the public interest shall be subject to legislative review.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 29 CHAISSON SAFETY REGULATIONS  
Requires any person under 21 who rides a motorcycle to wear a safety helmet and requires all riders to complete a training program and to have an "M" sticker on their license plate.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 37 HOLDEN EMPLOYMENT  
Provides relative to designating paydays under the Department of Labor.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 73, nays 18. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 39 MCPHERSON PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Requires legislative approval of certain cooperative endeavor agreements. (1/1/05)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 40 MCPHERSON PUBLIC CONTRACTS  
Provides for a small business program for information technology.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 41 MCPHERSON FISCAL CONTROLS  
Provides for settlement of certain claims by the state.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 44 NEVERS FUNDS/FUNDING  
Constitutional amendment creating the Dairy Farmer Support Fund. (2/3-CA13s1(A))  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 61, nays 28. The bill, not having received two-thirds vote of the members elect, failed to pass.  
Motion to reconsider pending.
- SB 48 HAINKEL CRIME/PUNISHMENT

Revises provisions relative to the definition of contraband prohibited in municipal or parish correctional facilities.

Signed by the Speaker of the House.

- SB 51 ULLO SCHOOLS  
Limits certain sick leave to up to 90 days and authorizes board to extend such leave beyond 90 days.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 57 HOLDEN SCHOOLS  
Requires that student field trips or extracurricular activities involving travel or lodging be regulated.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 70 THEUNISSEN SCHOOLS  
Authorizes the parish school board in certain parishes to name a headstart and community center in honor of a former teacher and community leader. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 72 MCPHERSON SUITS AGAINST STATE  
Requires written notification to the Budget Committee of any pending claims against the state that may equal or exceed \$2,500,000.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 73 MCPHERSON DENTISTRY  
Provides for dental patients to choose dental services, regardless of insurance coverage, if the patient approves in advance charges for which the patient will be responsible.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 79 DUPRE HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Deletes from the definition of "food establishment", for purposes of sanitary inspections, certain private clubs and establishments.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 82 BOISSIERE LOCAL RETIREMENT  
Changes the interest paid on Deferred Retirement Option Plan for members of the New Orleans Firefighters' Pension and Relief Fund who continue employment after participation in the plan ceases. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 90 BOISSIERE LOCAL RETIREMENT  
Authorizes the New Orleans Firefighters Association, Local 632 and the Firefighters' Pension and Relief Fund for the city of New Orleans to negotiate a cooperative endeavor agreement with the city of New Orleans. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 96 MARIONNEAUX APPOINTED OFFICIALS  
Provides for automatic removal of appointees not reappointed by a governor.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 118 MCPHERSON NATURAL RESOURCES DEPT  
Establishes the White Lake Property Fund and creates the White Lake Property Advisory Board. (1/1/05)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 128 N GAUTREAUX SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Provides for the compensation for certain officers of the governing board of Fire Protection District No. 7 of Vermilion Parish.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 129 THEUNISSEN SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Increases the Cameron Parish Ambulance Service District No. 2 board membership from five members to six members.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 133 C FIELDS SPECIAL DISTRICTS

Creates the Concord Estates Crime Prevention District.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.

- SB 182 LENTINI SUCCESSIONS  
Provides relative to forced heirs, spouses and the validity of testaments.  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.
- SB 191 IRONS LOCAL AGENCIES  
Removes limit on the amount of deposit in a bank by a local depositing authority.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 103, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 205 BOISSIERE LOCAL RETIREMENT  
Provides relative to Harbor Police to correct citations and clarify definitions. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 212 DUPRE SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Authorizes certain changes relative to the Terrebonne Economic Development District.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 218 C FIELDS SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Creates the South Burbank Crime Prevention and Development District. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 219 DARDENNE HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT  
Requires that juveniles in the custody of juvenile correction centers be immunized for Hepatitis B.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 224 MALONE TOPS  
Provides that a TOPS award may be applied to cover other "cost of attendance."  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 229 C FIELDS ELECTION CODE  
Prohibits the intimidation of a person at a polling place on election day and prohibits commissioners and poll watchers from carrying or possessing firearms.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 231 SCHEDLER ELECTION CODE  
Establishes a commission to insure clear, complete, and understandable ballot language describing constitutional amendment proposals. (1/1/05)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 243 BOISSIERE RETIREMENT SYSTEMS  
Provides for retirement contribution rate and accrual rates for the attorney general, secretary of state, and legislative employees. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 261 HINES ETHICS  
Authorizes employment of the immediate family members of a school board member or school superintendent as a certified guidance counselor.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 77, nays 22. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 275 NEVERS HOSPITALS  
Provides for additional reporting regarding health care services at LSU hospitals to the Senate and House health and welfare committees and for payment methodology.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 288 SCHEDLER FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides for the distribution of certain funds by the St. Tammany Parish Tourist and Convention Commission. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 101, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 290 BOISSIERE PAROCHIAL EMPLOYEES RET  
Provides with respect to DROP and member contributions. (gov sig)

Signed by the Speaker of the House.

- SB 334 HAINKEL HEALTH/ACC INSURANCE  
Authorizes the offer of health insurance free of any type of mandated coverage to individuals and employees of employers who employ 35 or fewer employees on an optional basis.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 96, nays 4. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 337 M SMITH LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR  
Provides for exclusion of urban or rural development monies in computing revenue necessary to require an audit.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 338 ADLEY ENVIRONMENT QUALITY DEPT  
Restricts dissemination of certain security sensitive information via the Internet  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 356 CHEEK MUNICIPALITIES  
Provides for renewal of certain additional sales and use taxes in the city of Shreveport as the codification of laws relative to the Shreveport Downtown Development District.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 363 HOLDEN SCHOOLS  
Provides for the state to discharge certain debts owed the state by the city of Baker School Board. (6/30/04)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 89, nays 8. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 364 C ROMERO DISTRICT ATTORNEYS  
Provides for funding of the 16th JDC district attorney.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 93, nays 1. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 394 BARHAM TAX/TAXATION  
Exempts diesel fuel from local sales tax or excise tax.  
(gov sig)  
Conference Committee report received and read. Lies over under the rules.
- SB 432 C D JONES WORKERS' COMPENSATION  
Changes the amount of attorney fees on workers' compensation awards to twenty percent of the recovered amount. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 442 ULLO CORONERS  
Provides relative to issuance of medical certifications by physicians.  
Read by title, reconsidered, returned to the calendar, under the rules.
- SB 463 DARDENNE FUNDS/FUNDING  
Provides for the investment of certain monies in the Louisiana Education Quality Trust Fund. (7/1/04)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 99, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 468 FONTENOT HAZARDOUS WASTE  
Establishes the Brownfields Cleanup Revolving Loan Fund.  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 97, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 479 B GAUTREAUX ETHICS  
Revises the definition of hospital service districts to which the nepotism prohibition does not apply.

- SB 492 SCHEDLER NURSING HOMES  
Creates the Nursing Home Quality and Efficiency Board.

Abolishes the Medicaid School-Based Administrative Claiming  
Trust Fund and provides for direct reimbursement of monies to  
public schools. (7/1/04)

- SB 495 SCHEDLER HOSPITALS  
Requires public hearings to be held in the location of the sale  
of a not-for-profit hospital.

- SB 538 CAIN INSURANCE POLICIES  
Provides that group and individual high deductible health  
policies are excluded from the rate limitation provisions for  
health benefit plans providing coverage for small employers.

passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered  
to the Senate.
- SB 545 DUPLESSIS SPECIAL DISTRICTS  
Changes the name of the New Orleans Business and Industrial  
District and provides for the composition of the board. (gov  
sig)  
Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call.  
By vote of 57 yeas, 42 nays.
- SB 553 DUPRE PROPERTY INSURANCE  
Provides certain requirements under the Coastal and FAIR Plans.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 560 FONTENOT ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY  
Provides relative to the Motor Fuels Underground Storage Tank  
Trust Fund. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,  
yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the  
Senate.
- SB 564 DARDENNE CHILDREN  
Provides relative to federal and state tax deduction,  
extraordinary medical expenses, and mortgage and rental  
payments as they apply to child custody obligations.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 579 C D JONES PUBLIC RECORDS  
Provides that certain records pertaining to negotiations  
relative to economic development activities shall not be public  
records until negotiations are concluded. (gov sig)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 594 BAJOIE PUBLIC SFTY/CORRECT DEPT  
Provides for a pilot program for post-release facilities.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 603 MCPHERSON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE  
Provides for release of information from the Protective Order  
Registry to department of health and hospitals, bureau of  
protective services, the governor's office of elderly affairs,  
elderly protective services and the attorney general's office.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 617 ULLO POSTSECONDARY ED  
Requires the Board of Regents to develop and maintain a state  
student financial aid plan.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 633 KOSTELKA CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Criminalizes nonpayment of child support.

- SB 636 MCPHERSON ETHICS  
Requires that a member of the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission  
be disqualified from participating in any transaction involving  
his leases.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage,

yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

- SB 645 HINES CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE  
Provides for updated definitions regarding controlled substances.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 655 DARDENNE SELF INSURANCE  
Provides changes in administration of joint self insurance programs by local housing authorities. (gov sig)  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 102, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 662 DARDENNE CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE  
Substitutes hydrocodone for and dihydrocodeinone as Schedule III controlled dangerous substance.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 679 CHAISSON CRIME/PUNISHMENT  
Provides with respect to criminal penalties for third, fourth, and subsequent DWI offenses.  
Called from the calendar.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 38, nays 62. Failed to pass, motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 691 L JACKSON PHARMACISTS  
Provides for changes to requirements for membership on the Medicaid Pharmaceutical and Therapeutics Committee.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 693 DUPRE VOTERS/VOTING  
Provides that in presidential primary election, persons registered as independent or not otherwise registered in a recognized political party may vote in a primary election for a recognized political party.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 695 MALONE PRESCRIPTION  
Provides relative to mineral rights in land acquired or expropriated by governmental entity. (9/1/04)  
Notice of Senate conferees appointed.
- SB 701 BAJOIE CHILDREN  
Provides relative to orientation for family child care providers receiving payments from Department of Social Services or Department of Education.  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 709 MICHOT PUBLIC RECORDS  
Provides for the disposition of original records and evidentiary status of reproduced records, except plats, maps, and photographs and provides relative to documentation of certain records in certain courts. (1/1/05)  
Signed by the Speaker of the House.
- SB 710 ELLINGTON BOATS/BOATING  
Prohibits persons under 16 from operating a personal watercraft, but authorizes such operation by those 13 years of age or older on 1/1/05, but less than 16, if they have completed a boating safety course.

- SB 730 DUPRE ETHICS  
Requires that payments over \$1000 for the expenses of certain public higher education employees be approved by the employee's board and makes the approval documents public records.  
Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 104, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 731 CAIN INSURANCE DEPARTMENT  
Establishes the Louisiana Theft and Insurance Fraud Prevention Authority. (8/15/04)  
Read third time by title, amended, roll called on final passage, yeas 94, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.
- SB 743 THEUNISSEN MILITARY AFFAIRS  
Provides benefits for Civil Air Patrol members injured or killed during performance of their duty. (gov sig)

SB 744 C FIELDS DISTRICT ATTORNEYS  
 Authorizes the district attorney for the 19th JDC to fix the salary of his assistant district attorneys. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 746 N GAUTREAUX COURTS  
 Provides relative to the civil jurisdiction of the city courts of Abbeville and Kaplan.  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 749 CAIN FUNDS/FUNDING  
 Provides for the distribution of the proceeds of all of the state sales tax on hotel/motel rooms in Vernon Parish. (7/1/04)  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 100, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 767 HAINKEL WATER/WATERWAYS  
 Prohibits the dredging of the bottom of Lake Pontchartrain in areas other than Jefferson Parish for certain purposes. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 769 HEITMEIER PUBLIC EMPLOYEES  
 Provides for payroll deductions for certain foreign corporations. (gov sig)  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 98, nays 0. Finally passed, ordered to the Senate.

SB 770 C FIELDS HOSPITALS  
 Includes University Medical Center in Baton Rouge as a hospital under the LSU Health Sciences Center, New Orleans.  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 772 MALONE SCHOOLS  
 Authorizes parish school boards in certain parishes to name an auditorium in honor of a former principal. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 778 BARHAM RETIREMENT SYSTEMS  
 Provides for certain oversight requirements when the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget reviews the annual operating budgets of certain retirement systems. (gov sig)  
 Signed by the Speaker of the House.

SB 785 C D JONES SCHOOLS  
 Provides for the creation of the Northeast Louisiana Delta Learning Center.  
 Read by title, returned to the calendar subject to call. Called from the calendar.  
 Read third time by title, roll called on final passage, yeas 52, nays 43. Failed to pass, motion to reconsider pending.

SB 792 DARDENNE STATE EMPLOYEE RET  
 Changes the retirement for new members of LASERS. (gov sig)  
 Reported with amendments. Rules suspended. Referred to the Legislative Bureau. (8,0) (Regular)  
 Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Rules suspended.  
 Read by title, amended, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.

SB 795 BOISSIERE ETHICS  
 Excepts salary and benefits paid to NOCCA faculty, staff or administrators from money raised by a foundation from the ethics code prohibition.

with riverboat gaming licensees as a non-key gaming employee under certain circumstances.
