Authorizes restaurants serving shrimp to display to customers information as to the origin of the shrimp.
Reported with amendments.
- SB 48 HAINKEL CRIME/PUNISHMENT
Revises provisions relative to the definition of contraband prohibited in municipal or parish correctional facilities to restrict the definition to the specified items.
Called from the calendar.
Read by title and finally passed, 34 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB 58 BARHAM HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Requires Louisiana nursing homes to provide notice of availability of their latest Department of Health and Hospitals annual inspection survey results to applicants at the time of admission.
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB 62 C FIELDS PROBATION/PAROLE
Provides that inmates who are terminally ill, including those serving sentences for 1st or 2nd degree murder, are eligible for medical parole consideration.

Deletes from the definition of "food establishment", for purposes of sanitary inspections, those private clubs where food is prepared and served exclusively for member consumption.

Provides relative to the Weights and Measures Law. (gov sig)

SB 199 M SMITH U S PROPERTY
Removes sunset provision relative to authorization of agreements ceding concurrent jurisdiction to the United States over certain lands acquired, leased, occupied, or controlled by or for the U.S. Department of Justice for operation of correction.
Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 209 ADLEY TOPS
Provides relative to the alternative means established for determining residency for TOPS purposes for certain dependent students graduating from eligible La. high schools. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments.

SB 219 DARDENNE HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Requires that juveniles in the custody of juvenile correction centers be immunized for Hepatitis B.
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.
Ordered engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 221 CRAVINS CRIME/PUNISHMENT
Prohibits the sentence of death for conviction of a capital offense when the juvenile offender had not reached his eighteenth birthday on the date of the offense.
Rules suspended; read by title, recommitted to the Committee on JUDICIARY B.

SB 241 IRONS CHILDREN
Requires certain licensed child care facilities to adopt a written safe sleep policy and to provide training.
Read by title, committee amendments read and adopted.

SB 258 C D JONES CAMPAIGN FINANCE
Classifies as "district office" the office of marshal or constable of a city court.
Reported with amendments.

SB 259 IRONS SCHOOLS
Requires schools to offer healthier food and beverage choices in vending machines on school campuses and to limit the hours of operation of vending machines.
Reported with amendments.

SB 283 DARDENNE TOPS
Eliminates the increase in the total required units of high school course work and the increase in computer-based course work to begin in 2007-2008.
Reported favorably.

SB 342 CHAISSON GAMING
Eliminates requirement that a video draw poker device accept coins equal in value to the amount of any minimum wager set for the machine.
Read by title and finally passed, 22 yeas and 12 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 344 M SMITH FAMILY LAW
Requires that a credit be added to the child support obligation of a person ordered to pay child support who has physical custody of the child for one hundred twenty days or more.
Read by title and finally passed, 33 yeas and 3 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 347 M SMITH ROADS/HIGHWAYS
Authorizes DOTD to sell timber on highway rights-of-way and provides for dedication of such proceeds to the Transportation Trust Fund for repair of roads not eligible for federal matching funds. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments.

SB 357 CHEEK GAMING
Permits advertising outside the premises at video draw poker

establishments and authorizes complementary food and drinks as a promotion to encourage play.

Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call.

- SB 372 THEUNISSEN CONSUMERS
Expand the use of proceeds obtained by a consumer from a consumer loan made by a lender pursuant to the Louisiana Motor Vehicle Financing Act.

SB 709 MICHOT PUBLIC RECORDS
Provides for the disposition of original records and evidentiary status of reproduced records, except plats, maps, and photographs. (1/1/05)
Reported with amendments.

SB 710 ELLINGTON BOATS/BOATING
Prohibits persons under 16 from operating a personal watercraft, but authorizes such operation by those 13 years of age or older on 8/15/04, but less than 16, if they have completed a boating safety course.
Called from the calendar.
Read by title and finally passed as amended 25 yeas and 10 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House.
Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB 711 MCPHERSON NURSING HOMES
Provides that Medicaid certified nursing home beds be dually certified for Medicare.
Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 713 MARIONNEAUX WORKERS' COMPENSATION
Exempts employers who fail to secure workers' compensation insurance or proper certification of self-insurance status from statutory immunity.
Reported with amendments.

SB 736 C D JONES APPOINTED OFFICIALS
Provides that the membership of every board and commission of the state of Louisiana reflect the state's population as nearly as practicable.
Reported by substitute.

SB 745 NEVERS PLANNING/ZONING
Changes the authority of a parish or municipal planning commission to adopt a master plan from mandatory to permissive. (gov sig)
Reconsidered. Read by title and returned to the calendar subject to call as amended.

SB 762 B GAUTREAUX PUBLIC LANDS
Authorizes the transfer of certain state property in Assumption Parish from DOTD to the Assumption Parish Police Jury. (gov sig)
Reported with amendments.

SB 768 HOLLIS SEIZURES/SALES
Requires a secured party who proceeds with repossession without judicial process to file a notice of repossession with the clerk of court and to pay certain fees. (2/3-CA7s2.1(A))
Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SB 771 CRAVINS CONTRACTORS
Prohibits hiring undocumented illegal aliens. (gov sig)

SB 806 DUPRE TAX EXEMPTIONS
Constitutional amendment to provide for the homestead exemption to certain people, certain land, to property occupied by a surviving spouse, by certain trusts, where usufruct has been granted for a lifetime and under bond for deed contracts.
