Constitutional amendment to prohibit the expropriation of property for use by certain private entities; to prohibit the transfer of expropriated property to private entities without first offering to the original owner; and to define "public purpose" for expropriation. (2/3-CA12s1(A))

- SB9 Smith, Mike AGRICULTURE/FOREST DEPT
Re-creates the Department of Agriculture and Forestry. (6/30/06)

 - Amendments proposed by the House read and concurred in, 36 yeas and 0 nays. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB20 McPherson TRAFFIC
Prohibits impoundment of motor vehicles for most traffic offenses and instead requires seizure of vehicle license plates.

- SB81 Jones ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE
Allows law enforcement officers to appear as witnesses in administrative hearings by telephone, video conference, or similar communication equipment. (7/1/06)
- Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.
- SB98 Shepherd EMPLOYMENT
Prohibits employment discrimination due to actual or perceived sexual orientation.
- Senate floor amendment read and adopted.
 - Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call as amended.
- SB100 Cravins HEALTH/HOSPITALS DEPT
Establishes the adult day health care program in the DHH division of Long-Term Care Supports and Services/Health Standards Unit as a state plan option entitlement program.

Enacts the Public Employee Partnership Act. (7/1/06)
- Made special order of the day No. 1 for 6/1.
- SB208 Michot ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
Amends the definition of "new direct job" for purposes of the Louisiana Quality Jobs Program. (gov sig)
- Reported with amendments.
- SB422 Jackson, L. LEGISLATIVE AGENCIES
Requires the establishment of a uniform system for reporting sources of revenue and expenditures, relative to judicial district indigent defender boards.
- Rules suspended; reported with amendments.
- SB445 Jackson, L. HOUSING
Provides for program priorities for housing needs in Katrina/Rita FEMA disaster areas and for citizens displaced from Katrina/Rita disaster areas. (gov sig)
- Read by title and finally passed, 35 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to

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the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

- SB510 Quinn INSURANCE POLICIES
Provides for homeowner's insurance policy claims for damages attributed to covered and noncovered losses under the policy.
- Rules suspended; reported with amendments.
- SB525 Gautreaux, N. AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES
Enacts the Cajun and Louisiana Creole Goods and Consumer Protection Law. (gov sig)
- Received from the House without amendments.
- Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB645 Mount COURTS
Provides for the consolidation of courts, offices, and officers in the judicial system of government in Orleans Parish.
- Made special order of the day No. 1 for 6/5.
- SB655 Adley MINERALS
Provides relative to remediation of oil and gas sites. (gov sig)
- Enrolled and signed by the President of the Senate.
- SB660 Barham INSURERS
Provides for changes in the manner in which ad valorem property taxes are assessed and paid by certain insurance companies. (1/1/07)
- Called from the calendar.
- Senate floor amendment read and adopted.
- Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call as amended.
- SB664 Dupre NATURAL RESOURCES DEPT
Provides relative to acquisition of land for certain coastal conservation, restoration and protection plans and projects. (gov sig)
- Read by title and finally passed as amended 37 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB673 Malone PUBLIC CONTRACTS
Requires certain successful bidders to provide a written and notarized declaration of certain information to the public entity prior to execution of a contract for public work exceeding \$500,000.
- Read by title and finally passed, 36 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB700 Jones EMPLOYMENT
Establishes the state minimum wage at \$6.15 per hour. (gov sig)
- Read by title and finally passed as amended 20 yeas and 18 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB703 Heitmeier PUBLIC CONTRACTS
Provides relative to certain performance-based energy efficiency contracts of political subdivisions. (7/1/06)
- Called from the calendar.
- Read by title and finally passed as amended 32 yeas and 2 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB708 Murray FIREFIGHTERS RETIREMENT

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Provides for service credit and benefits of the New Orleans Firefighters' Pension and Relief Fund. (gov sig)

- Read by title and finally passed, 38 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted and bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB726 Marionneaux ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL

Provides minimum payments to a permitted waste tire processing facility for waste tire material.

- Called from the calendar.
- Read by title and finally passed as amended 24 yeas and 10 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB748 Barham EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Provides relative to the duties and responsibilities of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness. (gov sig)

- Read by title and passed to a third reading.

SB751 Cheek CHILDREN

Requires criminal history checks prior to employment of certain nonlicensed persons providing healthcare services.

- Read by title. Returned to the calendar subject to call

SB752 Heitmeier PAWNBROKERS

Creates the Louisiana Board of Continuing Pawnbroker Education.

- Read by title and finally passed as amended 38 yeas and 0 nays. Title read and adopted, bill ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

SB753 Cravins EMPLOYMENT

Authorizes the state attorney general or local district attorney to issue a cease and desist order after discovering an employer has hired undocumented aliens. (gov sig)

- Read by title, engrossed and passed to a third reading.

SCR99 Bajois HEALTH CARE

Acknowledges, encourages and supports the Memorandum of Understanding between the VA and LSU which explores the opportunity of jointly constructing a medical facility in the city of New Orleans.

- Reported with amendments.

SCR105 Jones SECRETARY OF STATE

Directs the secretary of state to assess the steps that need to be taken to provide for satellite voting on election day for displaced voters and to provide a report on the requirements to the legislature.

SCR106 Jones PUBLIC SFTY/CORRECT DEPT

Directs the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to notify inmates under its supervision of the revisions to the law regarding the Louisiana Risk Review Panel, good time and diminution of sentence.

SCR107 Theunissen ROADS/HIGHWAYS

Requests strict enforcement of certain traffic laws on the I-10 Calcasieu River Bridge and requests DOTD to expedite the process to replace the bridge and its approaches.

SCR108 Schedler COMMENDATIONS

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Commends the efforts of the Health Services Recovery Council and its affiliated health planning groups serving the significantly impacted parishes of Cameron, Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Tammany and the Greater Baton Rouge area.

Authorizes the parish of St. Helena to levy and collect an additional sales and use tax
- Reported favorably.
- HB69 Toomy CLERKS OF COURT
Creates judicial administrative districts for the purpose of funding the clerks office
- Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB91 Farrar BOATS/SHIPS/VESSELS
Creates "no-wake" zones at certain boat launches and docking facilities
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB177 Smiley STATE SYMBOL
Provides for a state poem for the state of Louisiana
- Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- HB204 Hunter NURSING HOMES
Requires installation of supervised automatic fire and sprinkler systems in nursing homes

(Constitutional Amendment) Authorizes the legislature to create new judgeships for district courts with limited or specialized subject matter jurisdiction

Limits option of leaving certain retirement benefits to the member or another person or persons to certain beneficiaries

Provides relative to the burden of proof in establishing liability of a person filing a false report of child abuse
- Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB299 Daniel HIGHWAYS
Provides relative to the Louisiana Transportation Authority and creates the Transportation Mobility Fund
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

Provides with respect to the prudent management of state-owned land

Provides a limitation of liability and license suspension for health care providers during a state of emergency

Requires any bill for an insurance premium to identify the property upon which the premium is due

Requires restaurants to post signs at self-service buffets encouraging patrons to wash their hands prior to serving themselves

- Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB566 Cravins, Jr. WORKERS COMPENSATION
Expands coverage to include reinsurance contract and requirements for insurance company rating

- HB577 Powell, T. WORKERS COMPENSATION
Provides relative to insurance cost containment

Transfers the authority to issue controlled dangerous substances licenses from the Department of Health and Hospitals to the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy

- HB699 Montgomery COMMERCE
Creates the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act
 - Reported with amendments.
- HB702 Odinet FISHING/OYSTERS
Provides relative to season dates for harvest of oysters from the public seed grounds

- HB742 Pinac BUILDING CODES

HB795 Triche WILDLIFE & FISHERIES
Requires the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to control importation and ownership of big exotic cats

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB802 Frith FISHING/OYSTERS
Provides for opening and closing dates for oyster harvest in Calcasieu Lake and Sabine Lake and allows for use of mechanical dredges

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB830 Cazayoux FUNDS/INVESTMENTS
Authorizes investment in stocks of portion of endowed funds of a public college or university

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB835 Smith, Jack BOATS/SHIPS/VESSELS
Revises penalties for violations of state boating education requirements

- Signed by the President of the Senate.

HB836 Smith, Jack BOATS/SHIPS/VESSELS
Revises provisions relative to the reporting of collisions and accidents on the waterways

- Signed by the President of the Senate.

HB838 St. Germain WILDLIFE/RESOURCES
Relative to invasive, noxious aquatic plants designation and prohibitions

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

HB839 St. Germain FISHING/CRABS
Eliminates the special license to shed soft shell crabs

- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.

Provides relative to the penalty for use of another person's hunting license

- Signed by the President of the Senate.

HB857 Baldone CRIME/SEX OFFENSES
Provides with respect to registration requirements of sex offenders in certain circumstances

HB873 Cazayoux EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS
Prohibits convicted sex offenders from being housed in evacuation centers or FEMA trailer parks

Provides relative to the priorities for conservation, allocation, and rationing of intrastate natural gas supplies in the event of an emergency
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1070 Hopkins PROPERTY/PUBLIC
Provides relative to transfer of property in Caddo Parish from the state to lessees
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1077 Farrar RETIREMENT/TEACHERS
Provides with respect to retirement eligibility of a member of the Teachers' Retirement System of La.
- Received in the Senate; rules suspended; read first time by title, lies over under the rules.
- HB1086 Dove COASTAL RESOURCES
Requires Department of Natural Resources to submit an annual report on the status of barrier island projects and needs
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1090 Fauchaux TAX/INHERITANCE TAX
Provides relative to interest due on state inheritance tax
- Reported with amendments.
- HB1133 Dartez DISTRICT ATTORNEYS
Provides for the payment of health insurance premiums for certain retired district attorneys in the Twenty-Third Judicial District
- Notice House rejected Senate amendments, and House conferees appointed.

- HB1141 Hebert INSURANCE/PROPERTY
Exempts certain coverages from certain requirements for rates for policies offered by the Louisiana

- Rules suspended; reported favorably.
- HB1158 Quezaire TRANSPORTATION DEPT
Provides relative to TIMED Program bonds
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1161 St. Germain FISHING/COMMERCIAL
Authorizes night fishing for shad in Lake Verret and Lake Palourde
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB1173 Crowe HIGHWAYS
Provides relative to the hours when certain highway construction work may occur
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments, read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB1175 Salter MTR VEHICLE/REGISTRATION
Increases the fee for issuance of temporary permits authorizing the operation of certain trucks on Louisiana highways
- Reported favorably.
- HB1179 Fannin MTR VEHICLE/TRUCKS
Provides relative to the width of trucks and trailers transporting timber cutting or logging equipment
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1184 Powell, M. SCHOOLS/EMPLOYEES
Provides relative to documents placed in a school employee's personnel file on or before a specified date; permits the school employee to rebut and respond to such documents especially under certain circumstances

Provides for restrictions on local government enforcement of the Louisiana State Uniform Construction Code
- Reported favorably.
- HB1190 Guillory, M. MTR VEHICLE/TRUCK REGS
Authorizes the issuance of a special permit for the transport of specialized heavy haul equipment on interstate highways
- Signed by the President of the Senate.
- HB1193 Baldone CHILDREN/ADOPTION
Provides that state police conduct records checks relative to adoptive placement
- Reported favorably.
- HB1204 Quezaire MTR VEHICLE/TRUCKS
Provides relative to violation tickets issued to motor carriers
- Reported with Legislative Bureau amendments which were read and adopted. Read by title and passed to a third reading.
- HB1205 St. Germain ETHICS
Changes the amount of contributions or donations that a public employee who was affected by a disaster or emergency may accept from certain not-for-profit organizations or funds within certain not-for-profit organizations
