- HB147 LaFonta CONTRACTORS  
Provides criminal penalties for certain actions committed by a contractor  
- Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- HB155 Hardy CRIME  
Amends the definition of negligent injuring and negligent homicide to include attacks by dogs or other animals

Increases certain processing fees and exempts the payment of fees in certain cases relative to the expungement of arrest records  
- Read by title, amended, ordered engrossed, passed to 3rd reading - regular calendar.
- HB276 Fannin BUILDING CODES  
Provides for changes to the state uniform construction code  
- Reported favorably (11-0) (Regular).
- HB291 Greene TAX CREDITS  
Provides for the allocation of tax credits with annual or total program caps

- HB308 LeBas STUDENTS  
Provides for participation in a dual enrollment program at postsecondary education institutions by certain high school students enrolled in BESE-approved nonpublic schools or BESE-approved home study programs

Provides for unladen lift equipment to tow a vehicle
