Provides relative to records of registrars of voters  
- Rules suspended. Read by title and finally passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays. The bill was ordered to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.

Provides for early retirement for members of the La. State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS) with actuarial reduction of benefits; requires abolition of positions vacated under early retirement
