- SB86 Morrell ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY
Provides technical corrections to Title 30 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes. (8/15/11)
- Rules suspended. Read by title. Recommitted to the Committee on Environmental Quality.
- SCR9 Willard-Lewis CONDOLENCES
Expresses condolences upon the death of U.S. Army Staff Sergeant Quadi S. Hudgins, while on his third tour of duty.
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SCR10 Broome JOINT RULES
Requires a poverty impact statement in the fiscal note of legislation with significant fiscal effect.
- Introduced in the Senate; read by title. Rules suspended. Read second time and referred to the committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs.
- SCR11 Broome LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS
Designates May 4, 2011, as Teen Pregnancy Prevention Day and May, 2011, as Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month.
- Introduced in the Senate; read by title. Rules suspended. Read second time by title and adopted by a vote of 30 yeas and 0 nays. Ordered sent to the House.
- SR3 Donahue COMMENDATIONS
Commends St. Paul's School upon celebrating its 100th year anniversary.
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SR5 Michot SENATE
Designates April, 2011, as Esophageal Cancer Awareness Month.
- Read by title and returned to the Calendar, subject to call.
- SR6 Dorsey SENATE
Recognizes Tuesday, April 26, 2011, as Southern University Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
- Introduced in the Senate; read by title. Rules suspended. Read second time by title and adopted.
- SR7 Thompson LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS
Designates April 28, 2011, as "FFA Day" at the legislature.
- Introduced in the Senate; read by title. Rules suspended. Read second time by title and adopted.
- SR8 Broome TRUSTS
Requests Louisiana State Law Institute to study authorizing creation of testamentary and inter vivos trusts to provide for the care of an animal.
