Provides relative to administrative adjudication of certain ordinance violations in the city of Central
- Rules suspended. Read by title, passed by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB326 Ritchie NURSING HOMES
Repeals exemption for Washington Parish from the moratorium on additional nursing facilities or beds
- Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB328 Robideaux LIBRARIES
Provides for an increase in fees collected for the Lafayette Parish Law Library Commission
- Rules suspended. Read by title, passed by a vote of 29 yeas and 4 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB332 Pearson RETIREMENT/STATE-STWIDE
Relative to the Municipal Employees' Retirement System (MERS), the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System (MPERS), and the Firefighters' Retirement System (FRS), implements the recommendations of the Funding Review Panel by providing for board membership, benefit calculation, maintaining employer contribution rates at certain amounts, and employee contribution rates

- HB333 Danahay FIRE PROTECT/FIRE DEPTS
Provides relative to the maximum work hours required of certain employees of the Lake Charles Fire Dept.

(Constitutional Amendment) Provides for assets and property of the Patient's Compensation Fund

- HB345 LaFonta INSURANCE/HEALTH
Provides relative to coverage of prescription drugs by health benefit plans, including through a drug formulary
- Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.

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- HB348 Leger TAX CREDITS
Increases the amount of the tax credit for the rehabilitation of certain residential structures and extends the taxable periods in which the tax credit applies
- Rules suspended. The amended bill was read by title, passed by a vote of 33 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB349 Leger TAX CREDITS
Extends applicability of the tax credit for the rehabilitation of certain historic structures
- Rules suspended

- HB352 St. Germain RETIREMENT/FIREFIGHTERS
Changes the sunset date on a member's option to convert from regular retirement to disability retirement so as to retain the option for an additional five years
- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.
- HB353 Arnold DISTRICTS/HOSPITAL SERVC
Provides relative to the Parish Hospital Service District for the parish of Orleans
- Rules suspended. Senate floor amendments were read and adopted. The amended bill was read by title, finally passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB356 Brossett MUNICIPALITIES/NO
Provides relative to the appointment and terms of members of the Public Belt Railroad Commission for the city of New Orleans
- Rules suspended. Senate floor amendments were read and adopted. The amended bill was read by title, finally passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB361 Roy TRAFFIC/ACCIDENTS
Revises provisions relative to access to accident reports
- Committee amendments read and adopted. Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB365 Howard PUBLIC CONTRACT/BIDS
Revises public bid provisions
- Rules suspended. Senate floor amendments were read and adopted. The amended bill was read by title, finally passed by a vote of 33 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB368 Arnold PUBLIC PROPERTY
Authorizes the sale of school property of the Orleans Parish School Board to another public body for at least its appraised value without the necessity of procedures otherwise provided by law
- Rules suspended. The amended bill was read by title, passed by a vote of 36 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB369 Smith, Gary RETIREMENT/TEACHERS
Relative to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana (TRSL), allows certain reemployed retirees to receive retirement benefits upon reemployment
- Read by title and referred to the Legislative Bureau.
- HB372 McVea FUNDS/FUNDING
Establishes the MC Davis Conservation Fund within the Conservation Fund and dedicates certain state revenues from the MC Davis Property for purposes of the fund

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- Reported without Legislative Bureau amendments. Read by title and passed to third reading and final passage.
- HB374 Richardson LOCAL OFFL/POLICE CHIEFS
Provides relative to the powers granted to elected police chiefs in municipalities governed by the Lawrason Act
 - Rules suspended. Read by title, passed by a vote of 38 yeas and 0 nays, and ordered returned to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- HB375 Lorusso LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS
