- SB82 Buffington FUNDS/FUNDING  
Constitutional amendment to except the Medicaid Trust Fund for the Elderly from certain deficit provisions. (2/3 CA13s1(A))  
- Read by title, passed by a vote of 37 yeas and 0 nays, and sent to the House. Motion to reconsider tabled.
- SB108 Morrell VIDEO POKER  
Provides for suitability requirements for video poker license. (8/1/12)  
- Title of substitute read and adopted; becomes Senate Bill No. 747.
- SB111 Johns PUBLIC RECORDS  
Authorizes the Louisiana Board of Pharmacy to access expunged records under certain circumstances. (8/1/12)

SB198 Morrell VIDEO POKER

Provides relative to legislative oversight of certain video draw poker games. (8/1/12)

SB200 Morrell ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY

Requires owners of certain school buildings to have inspection for the presence of lead hazards.
