INSTRUMENTS TO BE HEARD:

<b>HCR 73</b>	<b>LEGER</b>	<b>JUVENILE PROCEDURE</b> Requests the Institute on Public Health and Justice to study the issue of raising the age of juvenile jurisdiction to include seventeen-year olds
<b>HCR 82</b>	<b>LEGER</b>	<b>CORRECTIONS</b> Creates the Louisiana Justice Reinvestment Task Force to develop certain sentencing and corrections policy recommendations
<b>HB 57</b>	<b>HONORE</b>	<b>WEAPONS/FIREARMS</b> Excludes the legislative auditor and designated investigative auditors from prosecution for the illegal carrying of weapons in certain circumstances
<b>HB 67</b>	<b>COX</b>	<b>WEAPONS/FIREARMS</b> Excludes retired district attorneys and retired assistant district attorneys from prosecution for the illegal carrying of weapons in certain circumstances
<b>HB 73</b>	<b>NORTON</b>	<b>DOMESTIC ABUSE</b> Provides relative to protection from abuse or violence by a family member, household member, or dating partner
<b>HB 86</b>	<b>NORTON</b>	<b>WEAPONS/FIREARMS</b> Creates the crime of unlawfully supplying a child with an Uzi submachine gun
<b>HB 100</b>	<b>PRICE</b>	<b>CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE</b> Provides with respect to the expungement and destruction of criminal records
<b>HB 117</b>	<b>HONORE</b>	<b>CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES</b> Provides for a proposition election regarding the legalization of marijuana
<b>HB 149</b>	<b>BADON</b>	<b>CRIMINAL/SENTENCING</b> Amends certain criminal penalties for possession of marijuana and prohibits the applicability of the Habitual Offender Law relative to possession of marijuana
<b>HB 153</b>	<b>BURNS, T.</b>	<b>CRIME</b> Creates the crime of unlawful distribution of material harmful to minors through the Internet
<b>HB 191</b>	<b>COX</b>	<b>PAROLE</b> Requires inmates being released because of diminution of sentence to submit to certain infectious disease testing before being placed on parole
<b>HB 424</b>	<b>HAVARD</b>	<b>LAW ENFORCEMENT</b> Provides with respect to cellular tracking devices
