1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 17:154.1(A)(6), relative to minimum requirements for instructional time for  
3 students in public schools; to provide for applicability of such requirements under  
4 certain circumstances; to provide for exceptions; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 17:154.1(A)(6) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §154.1. Length of school day and year; requirements

10 (6)(a) Effective for the 2016-2017 school year and thereafter, the provisions  
11 of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall not apply to any city, parish, or other public  
12 school that cannot meet those requirements because the school temporarily shared  
13 facilities with another school due to damages caused by a natural disaster or  
14 emergency that was declared by the governor pursuant to R.S. 29:724 and that was  
15 certified by the state superintendent of education and approved by the State Board  
16 of Elementary and Secondary Education as provided in Subparagraph (b) of this  
17 Paragraph. The state board may require that the school provide a minimum number  
18 of daily instructional minutes that is less than the requirements set forth in Paragraph  
19 (1) of this Subsection and provide other requirements it deems necessary to support  
20 student learning.

21 (b) Such certification by the superintendent and approval by the board shall  
22 be in accordance with criteria established pursuant to rules and regulations adopted  
23 by the board for such purpose in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

1            Such rules and regulations shall include but not be limited to a requirement that any  
2            such school not able to meet the requirements of Paragraph (1) of this Subsection  
3            shall submit to the state superintendent of education for approval, in accordance with  
4            time lines established by the state board, documented information explaining why  
5            the school could not meet such requirements, any efforts made by the school toward  
6            meeting the requirements, and a revised school calendar for the affected school year.

8            Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
9            signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
10           by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
11           vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
12           effective on the day following such approval.
