MOTOR VEHICLES

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Provides relative to duplicate driver's licenses and identification cards

Proposed law authorizes the Department of Public Safety, Office of Motor Vehicles to accept online applications for a duplicate driver's license or special identification card (ID card). Proposed law requires the application include to certain statements and a sworn affidavit. Proposed law prohibits a duplicate driver's license by mail or electronic commerce for a person who is 70 years of age or older, alien student or nonresident alien, or previously issued a duplicate.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may create a minimal expenditure impact to the Department of Public Safety (DPS), Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV) associated with coding changes to the driver's license system to accept applications online or by mail. DPS estimates a one-time SGF cost of \$1,948 to make coding changes. The Office of Technology Services (OTS) would perform this work at an estimated 24 hours of overtime by an IT Management Consultant 1 Developer (24 hours x \$80 per hour = \$1,920 x 1.45% Medicare tax = \$28; Total of \$1,948). The Legislative Fiscal Office believes that any additional IT work associated with this legislation will be incremental in nature and the department can potentially accomplish these tasks utilizing existing resources and budget authority as similar changes are enacted annually by legislative instrument and paid from base funding. To the extent that numerous pieces of legislation are enacted that require additional programming efforts, the department may require additional resources.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure. The proposed law does not change the existing fees charged for duplicate driver's license or identification cards that were lost or destroyed.
