COSMETOLOGY: Provides for a special permit within the Louisiana Cosmetology Act

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 37:563(13) through (17) and to enact R.S. 37:563(18) through
3 (21) and 584.1, relative to the Louisiana Cosmetology Act; to provide for definitions;
4 to establish a special permit for natural hair braiding services; to provide for permit
5 qualifications; to provide for fees to the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology; to
6 provide for exemptions; to provide for state preemption; and to provide for related
7 matters.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

9 Section 1. R.S. 37:563(13) through (17) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
10 37:563(18) through (21) and 584.1 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

11 §563. Definitions

12 As used in this Chapter, the following words have the following meanings:

13 * * *

14 (13) "Mechanical devices" means clips, combs, crochet hooks, curlers,
15 curling irons, hairpins, rollers, scissors, blunt-tipped needles, thread, and hair
16 binders.

17 (14) "Mobile salon" means a self-contained facility, where cosmetology is
18 practiced for a fee, that may be moved, towed, or transported from one location to
19 another.

1 §584.1. Special permit requirements for natural hair braiding services

2 A. A special permit is required for natural hair braiding services at any
3 location. Natural hair braiding services shall not include any of the following:

4 (1) The application of dyes, reactive chemicals, or other preparations to alter
5 the color of the hair or to straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair.

6 (2) The use of chemical hair joining agents such as synthetic tape, keratin
7 bonds, or fusion bonds.

8 B. Natural hair braiding is defined in R.S. 37:563 and may be used to
9 reference African hair braiding or styling, but is not limited to any particular cultural,
10 ethnic, racial, or religious forms of hair styles.

11 C.(1) To receive a special permit as a registered natural hair braider, a person
12 shall meet all of the following requirements:

13 (a) Review training materials on sanitation and safety prepared by the board.

14 (b) Pass a fifteen-question examination on sanitation and safety prepared by
15 the board.

16 (c) Complete the board's application for a natural hair braiding permit and
17 submit the application and completed examination to the board by mail, in person,
18 or on the board's website.

19 (d) Pay applicable fees not to exceed twenty-five dollars.

20 (2) The board shall issue a special permit upon verifying a person has passed
21 the examination by at least seventy percent.

22 (3) A person who holds a valid special permit issued pursuant to this
23 Subsection shall be exempt from all of the following requirements:

24 (a) A certificate of registration for beauty shops or salons.

25 (b) Renewal of the special permit.

26 (c) Payment of additional fees for the maintenance of the permit.

27 (d) Taking any additional examination.

28 (4) The board shall make the training materials, examination, and application
29 available at its office and on its website.

- 1 D. Ordinances by units of local government that prohibit natural hair
 2 braiding, natural hair braiding services, or natural hair braiders, or regulate any
 3 matter relating to the licensing, testing, training, facilities, or equipment of natural
 4 hair braiding, natural hair braiding services, or natural hair braiders are preempted
 5 by the provisions of this Chapter.
 6 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2026.

Abstract: Adds definitions and establishes a special permit within the La. Cosmetology Act.

Present law provides for definitions in the La. Cosmetology Act.

Proposed law retains present law and defines "mechanical devices", "natural hair braider", "natural hair braiding", and "natural hair braiding service".

Proposed law creates special permit requirements for natural hair braiding services.

Proposed law provides what natural hair braiding services shall not include.

Proposed law provides that natural hair braiding is defined in proposed law and may be used to reference African hair braiding or styling, but is not limited to any particular cultural, ethnic, racial, or religious forms of hairstyles.

Proposed law provides that in order to receive a special permit as a registered natural hair braider, a person shall meet all of the following requirements:

- (1) Review training materials on sanitation and safety prepared by the board.
- (2) Pass a 15-question examination on sanitation and safety prepared by the board.
- (3) Complete the board's application for a natural hair braiding permit and submit the application and completed examination to the board by mail, in person, or on the board's website.
- (4) Pay applicable fees not to exceed \$25.

Proposed law requires the board to issue a special permit upon verifying a person has passed the examination by at least 70%.

Proposed law provides for exemptions for a person who holds a valid special permit issued pursuant to proposed law.

Proposed law provides that the board shall make the training materials, examination, and application available at its office and on its website.

Proposed law provides that ordinances by units of local government that are related to proposed law are preempted by the provisions of present and proposed law.

Effective July 1, 2026.
