22	"B. Whoever commits the crime of obstruction of justice shall be subject to
23	the following penalties:

25	(6) When the obstruction of justice involves a civil immigration
26	proceeding, the offender shall be fined not more than five thousand dollars,
27	imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.
28	(7) When the obstruction of justice involves an official act of an agent or
29	employee of a governmental entity, the offender shall be fined not more than
30	<u>one thousand dollars, imprisoned for not more than six months, or both.</u> "
