AN ACT

To enact R.S. 14:134.4, relative to official misconduct and corrupt practices; to create the crime of unlawful accepting of a thing of value by a legislator; to provide the elements of the offense; to provide definitions; to provide penalties; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 14:134.4 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

**§134.4. Unlawful accepting of a thing of value by a legislator**

**A.(1) It shall be unlawful for a legislator or his spouse to accept any thing of economic value, either directly or indirectly, from a nongovernmental organization that receives any funds designated either directly by the Louisiana Legislature or a state agency.**

**(2) It shall be unlawful for any person to aid or abet any act prohibited by Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.**

**B. As used in this Section:**

**(1) "Legislator" means a sitting member of the Louisiana Legislature.**

**(2) "Nongovernmental organization" means a nonprofit group or**

1        **organization that receives funds from a governmental agency, department,**  
 2        **office, bureau, or other governmental entity administered by any branch or**  
 3        **political subdivision of either a foreign or domestic government.**

4                **(3) "Thing of economic value" shall have the same meaning as provided**  
 5        **in R.S. 42:1102, except that for purposes of this Section, "thing of economic**  
 6        **value" shall not include fundraiser event tickets, meals, or reimbursable**  
 7        **expenses that do not exceed a value of one thousand dollars in a calendar year.**

8                **C. Whoever violates the provisions of this Section shall be fined not less**  
 9        **than five thousand dollars nor more than ten thousand dollars, or imprisoned,**  
 10       **with or without hard labor, for not less than one year nor more than five years,**  
 11       **or both.**

Proposed law creates the crime of unlawful accepting of a thing of value by a legislator and makes it a crime for legislators, or their spouses, to accept a thing of economic value from a nongovernmental organization that receives any funds designated either directly by the La. legislature or a state agency. Proposed law also makes it a crime for any person to aid or abet any act prohibited by proposed law.

Proposed law provides definitions relative to proposed law.

Proposed law provides that a person convicted of unlawful accepting of a thing of value by a legislator will be fined between \$5,000 and \$10,000, or imprisoned, with or without hard labor, between one and five years, or both.

Effective August 1, 2025.
