SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 36

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE. Requests the division of administration, the Patient's Compensation Fund, and the Patient's Compensation Fund Oversight Board to consider implementation of an e-filing system for medical review panel requests and an e-payment system for filing fees.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the division of administration, the Patient's Compensation Fund, and the
3	Patient's Compensation Fund Oversight Board to study the feasibility and potential
4	costs of implementing an e-filing system for medical review panel requests and an
5	e-payment system for filing fees.
6	WHEREAS, R.S. 40:1231.8 requires that all malpractice claims against health care
7	providers covered by statute, other than claims validly agreed upon for submission to a
8	lawfully binding arbitration procedure, shall be reviewed by a medical review panel; and
9	WHEREAS, R.S. 40:1237.2 requires that all malpractice claims against the state, its
10	agencies, or other persons covered by statute, shall be reviewed by a state medical review
11	panel, administered by the commissioner of administration; and
12	WHEREAS, requests for review of a malpractice claim must be submitted to the
13	division of administration; and
14	WHEREAS, the procedures for both private and state malpractice claims provide that
15	requests for review are deemed filed if sent by authorized electronic means; and
16	WHEREAS, within forty-five days of receipt of confirmation of filing a claim, a
17	claimant must pay a filing fee in the amount of one hundred dollars per named defendant
18	health care provider; and

1	WHEREAS, claim requests must currently be filed via postal mail, in person, or via
2	facsimile and filing fees must be paid via postal mail, in person, or via bank wire transfer;
3	and
4	WHEREAS, implementation of an e-filing and e-payment solution for the process
5	would create a safe, secure, and reliable means of filing time-sensitive requests and ensuring
6	filing fees are paid as required; and
7	WHEREAS, any costs associated with accepting e-filings and processing e-payments
8	can potentially be added as a convenience fee to applicable filing fees; and
9	WHEREAS, electronic transmittal of requests for review of malpractice claims,
10	along with filing fees, will allow for more efficient and expeditious processing; and
11	WHEREAS, consideration of technology solutions to optimize the process will
12	benefit claimants, defendant health care providers, employers, insurers, attorneys, the
13	division of administration, the Patient's Compensation Fund, and the Patient's Compensation
14	Fund Oversight Board; and
15	WHEREAS, the study should include a determination of the ability to implement
16	these improvements under current legislative authority and the costs, if any, of implementing
17	recommended improvements.
18	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
19	urge and request the division of administration, the Patient's Compensation Fund, and the
20	Patient's Compensation Fund Oversight Board to study the feasibility of implementing an
21	e-filing system for medical review panel requests and an e-payment system for filing fees.
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the division of administration shall submit a
23	written report of the findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the legislature no later
24	than December 31, 2025.
25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
26	commissioner of administration, the executive director of the Patient's Compensation Fund,
27	and the chairman of the Patient's Compensation Fund Oversight Board.
