SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 58

CONGRESS. Memorializes Congress to oppose any proposal that shifts the cost of SNAP to the states.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To memorialize the Congress of the United States to oppose any proposal that shifts the cost
3	of SNAP to the states.
4	WHEREAS, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is the nation's
5	most critical anti-hunger program, providing essential nutritional support to more than forty-
6	two million low-income individuals and families across the United States, including
7	hundreds of thousands of Louisianians; and
8	WHEREAS, SNAP is currently fully funded by the federal government, ensuring
9	consistent and equitable access to nutrition assistance regardless of a state's fiscal capacity;
10	and
11	WHEREAS, the United States House of Representatives has proposed shifting a
12	portion of SNAP costs to states beginning in Fiscal Year 2028 through a sliding scale based
13	on state payment error rates, requiring states to contribute between five percent and
14	twenty-five percent of total SNAP benefit costs; and
15	WHEREAS, under this proposal, Louisiana would be required to contribute at least
16	ten percent of its total SNAP costs, placing an unsustainable financial burden on the state
17	budget and threatening the state's ability to maintain current benefit levels for vulnerable
18	residents; and

1	WHEREAS, this would require the state to contribute anywhere between \$283
2	million to \$473 million annually to support its share of SNAP costs, depending on the state's
3	error rate.
4	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
5	memorialize the United States Congress to reject any proposal that forces states to assume
6	a share of SNAP benefit costs, including cost-sharing plans tied to payment error rates, and
7	to preserve SNAP as a fully federally funded program.
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted
9	to the president of the United States, the secretary of the United States Senate, the clerk of
10	the United States House of Representatives, and each member of the Louisiana
11	congressional delegation.
