HEALTH CARE/PROVIDERS: Establishes a registry for individuals and entities that provide caregiving services

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> defines "department", "financial viability", "home- and community-based service provider", "home- and community-based services", and "infirm elderly".

<u>Proposed law</u> extends the home- and community-based service provider definition by providing that a home- and community-based service provider does not include a caregiver registry which establishes or maintains a registry that facilities referrals or matches for individuals seeking caregivers and which meets certain requirements.

<u>Proposed law</u> also adds definitions for "caregiver" and "caregiver registry". <u>Proposed law</u> otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a caregiver registry from participating in any of the following:

- (1) Employing, directing, or supervising caregivers.
- (2) Providing clinical oversight of caregivers.
- (3) Dictating any term or condition of a referred or matched caregiver's care relationship with an individual to whom the caregiver is referred or matched.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a caregiver registry to provide information regarding licensed healthcare providers and facilities through which the caregiver may need to operate to provide care giving services.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a caregiver registry to conduct a background check on the healthcare providers listed on the registry.

Proposed law prohibits the caregiver registry from referring to a licensed healthcare facility.

(Adds R.S. 40:2120.2(3)(f), (6), and (7) and 2120.8)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Amend provision of <u>present law</u> that provides what a home- and communitybased service provider does not include.
- 2. Prohibit certain actions that a caregiver registry can participate in.
- 3. Require a caregiver registry to provide certain information in regards to licensed healthcare providers and facilities where the caregiver may provide care giving services.
- 4. Require a caregiver registry to conduct a background check on the healthcare providers listed on the registry.
- 5. Make technical changes.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the reengrossed bill

- 1. Add requirements for a caregiver registry.
- 2. Expand the definition of "caregiver".
- 3. Prohibit a caregiver registry from referring, matching, or placing any caregiver to a licensed healthcare facility.
