

## RÉSUMÉ DIGEST

**ACT 320 (SB 64)**

**2025 Regular Session**

**Edmonds**

Existing law (R.S. 33:9097.9) created the Shenandoah Estates Crime Prevention and Improvement District in East Baton Rouge Parish.

Existing law provides that the district is governed by a 9-member board of commissioners composed as follows:

- (1) The President of the Shenandoah Estates Homeowners' Association, Inc.
- (2) Four members appointed by the board of directors of the association.
- (3) One appointed by the mayor-president of EBRP from a list of nominations submitted by the association.
- (4) One member appointed by the member of the governing authority of EBRP whose council district encompasses all or the greater portion of the area of the district from a list of nominations submitted by the association.
- (5) One member appointed by the member of the La. House of Representatives whose district encompasses all or the greater portion of the area of the district.
- (6) One member appointed by the member of the La. Senate whose district encompasses all or the greater portion of the area of the district.

New law retains existing law but transfers the appointing authority given to the mayor-president of EBRP to the mayor of the city of St. George. Retains provisions of existing law requiring that the nominee for the board of commissioners be from a list of nominations submitted by the association.

Effective August 1, 2025.
