SENATE BILL NO. 202

BY SENATOR KLEINPETER

ELECTIONS DEPARTMENT. Provides for the increase of parish board of election supervisor meetings in certain parishes for certain races. (8/1/26)

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S.18:423(E), relative to board of election supervisors; to provide
3 for meetings of the board of election supervisors; to provide for eligible
4 compensation days during an election; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 18:423(E) is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 §423 Parish boards of election supervisors

8 * * *

9 E. Compensation. Each member of the parish board of election supervisors
10 shall receive one hundred fifty dollars for each day, not to exceed ~~six~~ **seven** days,
11 actually spent in the performance of his duties in preparing for and supervising each
12 election held in the parish, except that each member of the board may be
13 compensated for not more than ~~eight~~ **nine** days for a presidential or regularly
14 scheduled or special congressional primary or general election. In addition, each
15 member of the board who is not a public official shall receive fifty dollars for each
16 day spent in court as a subpoenaed witness in litigation concerning the performance
17 of his duties as a member of the parish board of election supervisors in connection

1 with an election.

Present law provides that parish board of election supervisors receive one hundred fifty dollars for each day not to exceed six days spent in the performance of his duties.

Proposed law retains present law but changes the time period from six to seven days.

Present law provides that each member of the board may be compensated for not more than eight days for a presidential or regularly scheduled or special congressional primary or general election.

Proposed law changes this maximum compensation time to nine days.

Effective August 1, 2026.
