BY REPRESENTATIVES BRASS, BROUSSARD, CARPENTER, CARVER, FREIBERG,  
TERRY LANDRY, MARTINEZ, AND TAYLOR

FUNDS/FUNDING: Establishes the Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Program to enhance workforce training programs to meet employer demand in certain industry sectors

1 AN ACT  
2 To enact R.S. 17:1877, relative to the Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Program;  
3 to provide for establishment and administration of and reporting on the program; to  
4 establish a special fund in the state treasury and provide for deposit, use, and  
5 investment of monies in the fund; to prohibit program funds from supplanting certain  
6 higher education funding; to provide relative to the powers and duties of the Board  
7 of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges, the Board of Supervisors of  
8 Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, and the Board  
9 of Supervisors of Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College; to  
10 require reporting; to provide legislative findings; to provide for an effective date; and  
11 to provide for related matters.

12 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

13 Section 1. The legislature finds that Louisiana's economic competitiveness depends  
14 upon a skilled workforce aligned with high-wage, high-demand industry sectors including  
15 construction, manufacturing, healthcare, transportation and logistics, and information  
16 technology. It further finds that shortages of qualified instructional personnel limit the  
17 ability of the two-year public institutions to scale workforce training programs to meet  
18 employer demand. It is therefore the intent of the Legislature to establish a flexible

1 investment program to expand instructor capacity and provide rapid-response capability for  
2 major economic development projects.

3 Section 2. R.S. 17:1877 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

4 §1877. Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Program

5 A. There is hereby established the Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment  
6 Program, hereafter referred to in this Section as the "program", to promote the  
7 expansion of instructional capacity in high-wage, high-demand workforce programs  
8 and support shared instructor models between two-year public institutions and  
9 private sector employers.

10 B. The program shall be administered by the Board of Supervisors of  
11 Community and Technical Colleges, the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State  
12 University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, and the Board of Supervisors  
13 of Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, hereafter referred  
14 to in this Section as the "boards". The boards shall promulgate rules in accordance  
15 with the Administrative Procedure Act for the implementation and administration of  
16 this program, including establishing eligibility criteria, cost-sharing models, and  
17 allocation methodologies and defining qualifying industry sectors. Notwithstanding  
18 any provision of law to the contrary, rules promulgated pursuant to the provisions of  
19 this Section shall be submitted to the House Committee on Education, the Senate  
20 Committee on Education, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Senate  
21 Committee on Finance for oversight. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the  
22 contrary, initial rules for the program may be adopted through the emergency  
23 rulemaking procedure provided for in R.S. 49:962.

24 C.(1) There is hereby established in the state treasury as a special fund the  
25 Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Fund, hereafter referred to in this Section  
26 as the "fund". After allocation of money to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund  
27 as provided in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the  
28 treasurer shall deposit into the fund any monies transferred or appropriated by the

1 legislature and any monies designated for the fund and received or held by the state  
2 treasurer from donations, gifts, grants, or other revenue.

3 (2) All unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the  
4 fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the  
5 state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned  
6 on the investment of monies in the fund shall be credited to the fund.

7 (3) Monies in the fund shall be appropriated to the boards for  
8 implementation and administration of the program, including but not limited to any  
9 of the following:

10 (a) Support of rapid-response instructor deployment tied to major economic  
11 development projects.

12 (b) Expedited recruitment incentives.

13 (c) Compensation for temporary or contract-based instructors.

14 (d) Salary differential supplements.

15 (e) Accelerated program expansion.

16 (4) Monies appropriated from the fund shall not be used to displace, replace,  
17 or supplant any state general fund appropriations to public postsecondary education  
18 institutions under the supervision and management of the boards.

19 D. The boards shall submit an annual report no later than forty-five days  
20 prior to the regular session of the legislature to the House Committee on Education,  
21 the Senate Committee on Education, the House Committee on Appropriations, and  
22 the Senate Committee on Finance detailing the amount of funds allocated by the  
23 program, the industry sectors supported, the number of instructors supported, the  
24 number of rapid-response deployments, and the number of credentials produced.

25 Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
26 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
27 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
28 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
29 effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Establishes the Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Program ("program") for expansion of instructional capacity at two-year public institutions in high-wage, high-demand workforce programs.

Proposed law establishes the program to promote the expansion of instructional capacity in high-wage, high-demand workforce programs and support shared instructor models between two-year public institutions and private-sector employers.

Proposed law authorizes the management boards of the Louisiana Community and Technical College System, the Louisiana State University System, and the Southern University System ("boards") to promulgate rules pursuant to present law (Administrative Procedure Act) for the implementation and administration of the program, including establishing eligibility criteria, cost-sharing models, and allocation methodologies and defining qualifying industry sectors. Authorizes initial rules for the program to be adopted by emergency rule. Establishes legislative oversight committees for program rules.

Proposed law establishes the Workforce Instructor Capacity Investment Fund ("fund") as a special fund in the state treasury. Authorizes deposit by the treasurer of gifts, grants, and donations to the fund as well as any monies appropriated or transferred by the legislature. Provides for deposit and investment of monies in the fund.

Requires appropriation of monies in the fund to the boards for implementation and administration of the program, including but not limited to any of the following:

- (1) Support of rapid-response instructor deployment tied to major economic development projects.
- (2) Expedited recruitment incentives.
- (3) Compensation for temporary or contract-based instructors.
- (4) Salary differential supplements.
- (5) Accelerated program expansion.

Proposed law prohibits monies appropriated from the fund from being used to displace, replace, or supplant any state general fund appropriations to two-year public institutions.

Proposed law requires the boards to submit an annual report no later than 45 days prior to the regular session of the legislature to the House and Senate Committees on Education, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Senate Committee on Finance detailing certain metrics for the program.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Education to the original bill:

1. Expand program to include two-year public institutions in La. State University and Southern University systems, in addition to La. Community and Technical College System institutions.
2. Grant certain authorities to the management boards of the La. State University and Southern University systems.
3. Make technical and conforming changes.
