Current law provides for the number of additional commissioners allowed at each precinct, based on the population size and election type. Proposed law adds the primary and general elections for party primary offices and the fall general election held on the sixth Saturday after the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of a congressional election year to the list of elections that shall have additional commissioners.

The Secretary of State reports that when budgeting for these new elections included in proposed law, they considered them statewide elections and budgeted them similarly to the other statewide elections included in current law. The proposed law codifies the existing practice of the department; therefore, no additional expenditures are anticipated.
