

1 2030 Master Plan, the Vision Sulphur Plan, and the Vermilion Parish Comprehensive
2 Resiliency Plan; and

3 WHEREAS, the LWCF derives its dollars from offshore oil production revenues
4 from the outer continental shelf rather than taxes, and is a dedicated recipient of funds
5 through the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006, along with Louisiana and other
6 gulf coast states, highlighting our state's coastal needs as a national conservation priority;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, the United States Congress reauthorized the Land and Water
9 Conservation Fund in December 2015, and there is strong bipartisan support for ongoing
10 authorization of this important federal law.

11 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
12 express its support for the United States Land and Water Conservation Fund and its
13 continued beneficial contributions to the state's citizens, economy, and environment.

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
15 governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the Louisiana congressional delegation.
