RETIREMENT SYSTEMS: Provides relative to the printing of certain statutes regarding public retirement systems that were unconstitutionally enacted

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To authorize and direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to direct the printer of the
3	Louisiana Revised Statutes to stop printing unconstitutional statutory language
4	relative to the cash balance plan for some state retirement systems.
5	WHEREAS, the legislature enacted Act No. 483 of the 2012 Regular Session of the
6	Legislature of Louisiana, creating a cash balance retirement plan; and
7	WHEREAS, Retired State Employees Association v. State, 119 So.3d 568 (La., 2013)
8	affirmed the district court finding that Act No. 483 of the 2012 Regular Session of the
9	Legislature of Louisiana was enacted in violation of La. Const. Art. X, §29(F); and
10	WHEREAS, the printer of the Louisiana Revised Statutes continues to print statutory
11	provisions as enacted by Act No. 483 of the 2012 Regular Session of the Legislature of
12	Louisiana and continues to print headnotes indicating that affected Sections were enacted
13	in violation of La. Const. Art. X, §29(F); and
14	WHEREAS, some affected Sections have been subsequently amended to remove the
15	unconstitutional portions, thus rendering the headnote confusing to a user of the statutes.
16	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
17	authorize and direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to direct the printer of the Louisiana
18	Revised Statutes to stop printing the language added by Act No. 483 of the 2012 Regular
19	Session of the Legislature of Louisiana to R.S. 11:62 (4)(introductory paragraph),
20	(5)(introductory paragraph), and (11)(introductory paragraph) as follows:

12	authorize and direct the Louisiana State Law Institute to direct the printer of the Louisiana
13	Revised Statutes to stop printing, in their entirety, R.S. 11:62(4.1), (5.1), and (11.1) and
14	1399.1 through 1399.7 as enacted by Act No. 483 of the 2012 Regular Session of the
15	Legislature of Louisiana.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge
17	and request that the printer of the Louisiana Revised Statutes stop printing the headnote
18	regarding Retired State Employees Association v. State, 119 So.3d 568 (La., 2013) that
19	appears at R.S. 11:62, 102, 542, 883.1, and 1145.1.
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that two suitable copies of this Resolution be
21	transmitted to the Louisiana State Law Institute and that the Louisiana State Law Institute
22	forward a copy of this Resolution to the printer of the Louisiana Revised Statutes.
